
The complete disorganization of everything in this city by the great fire of June 20th last, has delayed the issue of the present proceedings.

The M. W. the Grand Master addressed grand lodge as follows:-

#### ADDRESS OF GRAND MASTER.

Officers and Members of Grand Lodge:

My Brothers,—In the short interval that has elapsed since we assembled in grand lodge, we have been forcibly reminded of the uncertainty of human life. The solemn notes that betoken the dissolution of this earthly tabernacle have again sounded their awful warning, and another spirit has been summoned to the land where our fathers have gone before us.

Our honored and distinguished brother, the Right Worshipful William H. A. Keans, elected at the last annual communication to the high office of Deputy Grand Master, has passed from labor in the terrestrial lodge, and entered into rest.

The masonic record of our eminent brother is inseparably connected with the history of our ancient craft in this jurisdiction. From his early manhood, an active member of the fraternity, he was soon advanced to the responsible position of master of the lodge, ruling with firmness and courtesy. In the Provincial and District Grand Lodge under England, he held, during many successive years, responsible positions. At the organization of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick he took an active part, giving to the convention of lodges the benefit of his matured judgment, conservative sagacity, and great masonic experience. Chosen as the first treasurer of grand lodge, he was annually re-elected by acclamation, and continued in that important office until the last annual communication, when he was unanimously advanced to the distinguished position of Deputy Grand Master.

I need not recall to your memories the thoughtful, earnest words with which, in grand lodge at the time of installation, on the 28th of September last, he acknowledged the honor conferred on him by his brethren. While then referring to his failing health, he assured the craft that during so long as it pleased the Great Architect of the universe to prolong his life, his best services would be as ever, devoted to the fraternity. These were his last words among us. Within two days thereafter he closed a long, active and distinguished masonic life, and full of years and honors, passed to his place in the "temple not made with hands."

My brothers, we mourn his loss from our councils. We cherish his memory in our hearts. His example lives for our imitation.

I have summoned this special communication of grand lodge that suitable record may be made in memory of our deceased brother, and that the vacancy, which we mourn, in the office of Deputy Grand Master may be supplied as provided by our Constitution.

It was moved by R. W. Bro. B. L. Peters, P. G. M., and

Resolved, That so much of the address of the M. W. the Grand Master as relates to the death of the late R. W. brother Keans, be referred to a special committee to report thereon.

The M. W. the Grand Master appointed as such committee R. W. Bros. B. Lester Peters, William Wedderburn, John V. Ellis and William F. Bunting.

The committee appointed as above submitted the following report, which report, on motion of R. W. Bro. Peters, was received, and the resolutions contained therein unanimously adopted.

## REPORT OF COMMITTEE.

To the Grand Lodge of the Ancient and Honorable Fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswich:

The committee to whom was referred the address of the M. W. the Grand Master at this special communication of grand lodge, feel sensibly the loss sustained by the craft in the lamented death of R. W. Brother William H. A. Keans, and cordially concur in the just and eloquent tribute paid by the Grand Master to the memory of one who was alike eminent as a mason and beloved in social life.

Your committee submit, for the consideration of grand lodge, the following resolutions :---

Resolved, That this grand lodge receives with deep and sincere sorrow the announcement of the death of Right Worshipful Brother William H. A. Keans, Deputy Grand Master.

And further

Resolved, That in the death of R. W. Brother Keans the craft in this jurisdiction mourns the loss of a distinguished member of the fraternity, who, during a long life of zealous and active masonic service by precept and example, ever maintained and exhibited the tenets of his masonic profession, and as a citizen discharged the varied duties of responsible public positions with acknowledged integrity, ability and zeal.

And further

Resolved, That a suitable memorial page be published with the proceedings of grand lodge, in affectionate remembrance of our deceased brother.

And further

Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be transmitted under the seal of grand lodge, as an expression of respectful sympathy with the widow and family of our beloved brother in their sad bereavement.

The M. W. the Grand Master delivered his annual address as follows:-

## GRAND MASTER'S ANNUAL ADDRESS.

To the Officers and Members of Grand Lodge:

Brothers,—We assemble at the tenth annual communication of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick with sorrowful hearts in the presence of the great calamity that has recently visited our city. Last year we rejoiced with thankfulness as we acknowledged the goodness of the

Great Architect of the Universe in the prosperity with which we were surrounded. To-day we bow our heads in submission to the Divine Will under the storm that has swept over us.

On the twentieth day of June last, the scourge of fire laid in ashes three-fourths of our city, and we stood appalled at the greatness of the disaster which, for a time, seemed to overwhelm every hope. But the very magnitude of the calamity gave the first incentive to exertion, as from all directions were borne in upon us help for the present and encouragement for the future. Our deep distress awoke the kindliest sympathy, and former rivalries were forgotten and sectional differences disappeared as from every part of the Dominion, from sister provinces, from the United States, and from the mother country, substantial help and cordial sympathy awoke us to effort, and the few months that have elapsed witness exertion happily made to restore our trade and rebuild our desolated homes.

In this great distress our beloved fraternity had its full share, the city lodges having, with their place of meeting, lost all their regalia and masonic property. Through the forethought of the V. W. the Grand Secretary, the regalia of grand lodge was saved from destruction, but the valuable library and other property of grand lodge were destroyed. Among the individual sufferers, in a few hours rendered homeless and destitute, were many members of the fraternity. A General Masonic Board of Relief was immediately organised; liberal contributions were received from sister grand lodges and other masonic bodies, and from sympathizing brethren, and thus we were enabled to afford some present assistance to those most in need of help. The full particulars of this organization and of the various contributions will be laid before you, and grand lodge will make suitable record of the generous assistance and fraternal sympathy which in this time of our deep distress have gladdened our hearts and enabled us to afford substantial relief to our suffering brethren.

In accordance with resolution of grand lodge the subject of the fund of benevolence was brought under the consideration of the craft in this jurisdiction by the V. W. the Grand Secretary, whose report thereon will be laid before you. I refer to this subject especially to bring to the notice of grand lodge, that soon after the last annual meeting I received a communication from V. W. the Rev. Francis Partridge, Grand Chaplain, suggesting that a special service for public worship should be held on the Festival of Saint John the Evangelist, at which he kindly offered to address the fraternity, a collection being made in aid of the fund. To this suggestion I cordially and thankfully assented.

By the courteous permission of the Rev. Canon DeVeber, rector, Saint Paul's Church, Portland, was opened to the fraternity, and a choral service of public worship held on the evening of the festival. The craft assembled in large numbers with masonic regalia, and an eloquent and instructive sermon was preached by the V. W. the Grand Chaplain.

By special request I installed the Worshipful Master of Albion Lodge, No. 1; St. John's Lodge, No. 2; Solomon's Lodge, No. 6; Leinster Lodge, No. 19; and New Brunswick Lodge, No. 22. I also made official visitation and inspection of the work of the following lodges: Hibernia, No. 3; Sussex, No. 7; Union of Portland, No. 10; Alley, No. 14; Northumberland, No. 17; Miramichi, No. 18; and Campbellton, No. 32, all of which lodges I found in a most satisfactory and prosperous condition. I had arranged to visit officially the other lodges in the jurisdiction during the months of July and August, but unhappily, to my very great regret, I was prevented by illness from carrying out my intention.

I had made appointment personally to constitute, during the month of June, the new lodges at Andover and Campbellton under warrant from the grand lodge, but the disastrous fire of the 20th of June prevented my leaving the city.

I deputed Past Master Fairweather to consecrate Benjamin Lodge at Andover, and submit herewith his report to me.

To the Most Worshipful Robert T. Clinch, Grand Master:

M. W. SIR AND BROTHER,—I beg to report that under your authority conveyed to me by Right Worshipful Brother Edwin J. Wetmore, D. G. M., I proceeded on Tuesday morning last to Andover, and on Wednesday evening, the 19th instant, constituted Benjamin Lodge, No. 31, in due and ample form, and installed the Worshipful Master elect, W. Bro. Thomas T. Beveridge, M. D. I was ably assisted by W. Bros. A. J. Stewart and George Kilnapp, who accompanied me from St. John. I have also to report that our esteemed Brother R. W. Benjamin R. Stevenson, P. S. G. W., met us at Woodstock Junction and offered to render us any assistance, and kindly arranged his business so as to attend on Wednesday evening, when he took the position of S. G. W., W. Bro. Kilnapp acting as J. G. W., and W. Bro. Stewart as Grand Secretary and G. D. of C.

We had the pleasure of meeting the W. M. of Fort Fairfield Lodge, who travelled a distance of ten miles to be present, and kindly assisted in the work. A number of the P. M.'s of his lodge accompanied him. R. W. Bro. Dibblee, P. D. G. M., with a number of the brethren, left Woodstock on Wednesday by train, but did not arrive until after the completion of the ceremonies.

We received every attention from the brethren of Benjamin Lodge, and the W. M. did all in his power to make our visit pleasant.

I handed the dispensation to the Grand Secretary, as also a copy of the By-Laws of the Lodge, and instructed the Secretary to transmit a copy of the minutes to the Grand Secretary.

I have appointed the following named representatives of this grand lodge at sister grand lodges: R. W. Bro. Coote M. Chambers, of Victoria, near the Grand Lodge of British Columbia; R. W. Bro. Edgar P. Snow, of Cheyenne, near the Grand Lodge of Wyoming; W. Bro. Thomas H. Lynch, of Indianapolis, near the Grand Lodge of Indiana.

The Grand Secretary will submit to you the papers connected with the organization of a grand lodge for the island of Cuba, with an application for recognition, which I commend to your careful consideration.

Upon the invitation of the M. W. the Grand Master of Nova Scotia, I visited Halifax at the meeting of the grand lodge of Nova Scotia on the 6th of June last, accompanied by R. W. Past Grand Master Peters, and was present at the dedication of the new masonic hall in that city, and installed the grand officers for the year.

We mourn the death of one brother who has been a constant attendant at all our sessions, and who possessed many qualities to attract men towards him. I allude to Brother Henry Card, the grand organist, whose death suddenly occurred on fifteenth May last. Brother Card was an Englishman by birth, and received a special musical education, which long maintained him in the front rank of musicians in this city. To some eccentricities of nature and disposition, he added a keen sense of the humorous, and he loved the companionship

of sunny natures and minds sparkling with brilliant thoughts. The warm companionship which grows out of close masonic association was very dear to him, and in all his connection with his masonic brethren, he exhibited the gentleness and tenderness of a child. We cannot allow his place to become vacant in this grand lodge without marking in some way our sense of the loss we have sustained by his death, and without an expression of our tender sympathy for his family.

About the time of our last annual session there died a brother with whose reputation the older masons of every jurisdiction on this continent was intimately acquainted. I allude to the venerable Brother John Dove, who for fifty years was grand secretary of the grand lodge of Virginia, a position he held when the pen dropped from his fingers, and he answered the summons which all of us must obey—a sage and teacher in the craft, the Nestor of his grand lodge—never missing in his fifty years of service one annual meeting. Actuated by the love of freemasonry, and in his daily life exemplifying its teachings, we can scarcely mourn that in the fulness of time such a brother readily answers the demand made of him and lays down his well rounded life, which has been glorified by unfaltering devotion to the cause of mankind.

The whole world was startled by the calamity which, in the early part of the year, destroyed the Southern Hotel at St. Louis, causing a loss of many lives. Among those who fell victims to that calamity was one of the best known masons in America-George F. Gouley, the grand secretary of the State of Missouri. As a writer on masonic principles, a teacher of masonic law, Bro. Gouley had no superior. As a warm-hearted man, a devoted mason, his fame was everywhere, and the words of his own Grand Master over his remains fully express his character-"On many a hard fought field he has contended for the purity and the perpetuity of the great principles of masonry, and high over all the tumults of human passion he has borne the white banner of peace with faith, hope and charity, and has at last fallen at his post with it firm in his grasp, with not a single blot upon its folds." To our sorrowing brethren in Missouri we can at least extend assurances of our appreciation of our deceased brother's work, and of respect for his memory.

In England the fraternity mourn the loss of an eminent brother, the late Earl of Shrewsbury, the Provincial Grand Master of Staffordshire, who died suddenly at his London residence on the 11th May. Deeply interested in freemasonry, under his fostering care the local charities of

the fraternity rapidly increased, while his splendid residence at Alton Towers was thrown open with liberal hospitality for brethren from many parts of the globe. Presiding at the annual festival of the Boys' Masonic School in 1872, the proceeds of the grand feast realised £5,510 sterling for that splendid charity. In 1875 he occupied the chair at the festival for the Asylum for Aged Masons, when £7,020 sterling were collected, and in February of the present year, at the same festival, he again presided, when the sum of £12,656 was realized. We honor brethren who are eminent, as masonic writers, jurists, and who reach high position. Let us drop a kindly tear as well for the illustrious dead who amid many pressing cares work fervently and earnestly to advance the splendid charities of our ancient fraternity.

The report of the Board of General Purposes and the reports of the Grand Treasurer and Grand Secretary will be laid before you, and will afford you the fullest information relating to the material progress of the craft during the past year, and the work accomplished in the chief executive departments of grand lodge.

The limited accommodation in this small room where we to-day assemble brings to our attention the urgent necessity that exists for the erection, at an early day, of a masonic hall in this city. The destruction by fire of the rooms occupied for many years by the craft in this city, on the eastern side of the harbor, renders immediate action imperative. You will be glad to know that the New Brunswick Masonic Hall Company are taking prompt action in the matter, and I cannot too strongly urge upon grand lodge the importance of giving every assistance to the company in furtherance of the work to secure at an early day the erection of a building suitable to the requirements of the fraternity, and worthy of our ancient craft.

It was moved by R. W. Bro. John V. Ellis, P. G. M., and

Resolved, That the address of the M. W. the Grand Master be referred to a special committee to report upon the several subjects contained therein.

Whereupon the following brethren were appointed such committee:—

R. W. Bros. John V. Ellis, Robert Marshall, B. Lester Peters and William Wedderburn. The Grand Secretary submitted his annual report and account, as follows:—

4. He superintended the printing of the usual number of copies of the proceedings of the last annual communication, and distributed them as in former years.

5. Under direction of the Most Worshipful the Grand Master he forwarded commissions, under the seal of grand lodge, to the following representatives of grand lodge:—

6. Following out the order of grand lodge at the last annual communication, he addressed circulars on the 14th December to each

Sept.

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following offer of compromise was made by the company and accepted by the policy-holders:—twenty-five per cent cash to be paid September 20th instant, and the company's drafts or notes, bearing seven per cent interest, at three, six and nine months from the 20th September for the balance, in three equal payments. On the 20th instant he received a check on the Maritime Bank for one hundred and seventyeight dollars, which he immediately paid over to the Grand Treasurer. and holds three notes of the company, of one hundred and seventyeight dollars each, bearing seven per cent interest, payable at the Maritime Bank of St. John, on the 23rd December, 23rd March and 23rd June next respectively.

The six Lodges, viz.; Albion No. 1, St. John's No. 2, Hibernia No. 3, Union of Portland No. 10, Leinster No. 19, and New Brunswick No. 22, lost their warrants, jewels, regalia, banners, and all other paraphernalia. Some of them their records and seals. The banners of Carleton Union Lodge No. 8, of Carleton, which happened to be in the hall at the time, were unfortunately lost. The destruction was complete, and the loss to the craft severe and irreparable.

10. July 10th. The Grand Secretary's office was removed to a room in the south-east angle of the new market house, Charlotte street.

11. July 11th. He ordered, through R. W. Bro. Alexander Hay, of Edinburgh, representative at the Grand Lodge of Scotland, five hundred parchment certificates. The plate, which was engraved in Edinburgh, is left in the keeping of Bro. Hay. A portion of the certificates has since come to hand.

12. July 20th. By order of the board of general purposes he effected insurance on the property of grand lodge in his office, in the Imperial Fire Insurance Company, of which R. W. Bro. Marshall is the agent. Fifteen hundred dollars at 11 per cent. premium.

13. The Grand Secretary feels confident that the craft throughout the jurisdiction deeply deplore the great loss they have sustained in the destruction of the grand lodge library. It had been his constant aim, and he had labored "in season and out of season," since the organization of grand lodge to gather together as far as opportunity and the funds placed at the disposal of the Library Committee would permit, all the works within reach upon masonic and kindred subjects. Success had so far attended these labors (to him labors of love) that at the time of the fire quite a large and valuable collection of works — many of them rare and venerable with age - was in the possession of grand lodge, awaiting the erection of the contemplated masonic hall, and suitably equipped rooms, to make them available to the craft.

Not quite disheartened and not at all hopeless of future efforts, he shall make it his aim and study, while filling his present position in grand lodge, to replace, as far as possible, the loss sustained in this respect.

To this end he has addressed circulars to the grand secretaries of grand lodges and other masonic bodies on both sides of the Atlantic, fraternally soliciting from them contributions in printed proceedings, reprints, constitutions, etc., and he feels confident that this appeal will be responded to with generous consideration. He has great pleasure in reporting the reception so far, of the following, free of cost, except some slight express expenses, viz.: —

From Bro. Joseph E. N. Holder, of New Brunswick Lodge, No. 22, a full set of the proceedings of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick. The first contribution received.

From R. E. Frater Thomas J. Corson, Grand Recorder of the Grand Commandery of New Jersey, complete sets of the proceedings of the Grand Chapter, Grand Council, and Grand Commandery of New Jersev.

From R. W. Bro. John J. Mason, Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Canada, a bound volume being a reprint of that grand lodge from the date of organization to 1860, and pamphlet proceedings from 1860 to 1876; a copy of the constitution, A. D. 1877; a copy of resolutions and rulings; and a copy of the ceremonies of consecrating a lodge and installing officers.

From R. W. Bro. John F. Burrill, Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Illinois, a reprint of the proceedings of that grand lodge from its organization to 1860, and unbound proceedings from 1870 to 1876, also a copy of the constitution.

From R. W. Bro. John W. Abell, Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of California, eleven bound volumes, being complete proceedings of that grand lodge from organization to 1874, and pamphlets for 1875 and 1876; four bound volumes, being complete proceedings of the Grand Chapter from organization to 1875, and pamphlets for 1876 and 1877; one bound volume, being complete proceedings of the Grand Council from organization to 1873, and pamphlets for 1874-5-6; one bound volume, being complete proceedings of the Grand Commandery from organization to 1871, and pamphlets for 1872, '73, '74, '75 and '76; also, constitutions, form of trial, monitor and sundry forms.

From R. W. Bro. James M. Austin, Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of New York, the proceedings of that grand lodge from 1860 to 1876; also, a copy of the constitution.

From R. W. Bro. Ira Berry, Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Maine, the proceedings of that grand lodge from 1867 to 1877.

From R. W. Bro. William R. Bowen, Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Nebraska, the full proceedings of the Grand Lodge, Grand Chapter, Grand Council and Grand Commandery of Nebraska.

From R. W. Bro. Edward C. Parmelee, Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Colorado, complete sets of the proceedings of the Grand Chapter and Grand Commandery of Colorado.

The promise of contributions from other jurisdictions has been made, which will, no doubt, be fulfilled in due time.

The Grand Secretary confidently calls upon grand lodge to continue its efforts in furtherance of the new library, by such money grants from time to time as the funds at its disposal will permit, and the importance of the work would seem to demand.

14. Although not strictly within the compass of his report he nevertheless feels it a bounden duty to state for the information of all who may read the proceedings of grand lodge, that the several lodges in the City of St. John, have, since the fire, been the recipients of a handsome present of a set of officers' collar jewels of solid silver and very massive, a solid silver altar jewel, a set of rich watered silk collars, and an elegant ballot box. The jewels have a suitable presentation inscription engraved on each of them. The jewels were the gift of W. Bro. John Street, jeweller, of Montreal, and the collars and ballot box of R. W. Bro. Henry M. Alexander, Grand Treasurer of the Grand Lodge of Quebec, and the representative of this grand lodge at that grand east.

15. He has pleasure in stating that grand lodge has had presented to it for the Grand Secretary's office, three wood cuts and twelve electrotypes of the seals of grand lodge, and the signature of the Grand Secretary. These useful and valuable articles are the gift of W. Bro. Alfred F. Chapman, W. Bro. Albert L. Richardson, and W. Bro. John H. Lakin, of Boston, Massachusetts. Bro. Chapman in his note, written August 17th, accompanying the gift of himself and his associates, states "no doubt you will find ample opportunity to use all "the monies at command for purposes of masonic relief, and this will "only relieve us of a part of the obligations we owe to the craft in St. "John. It will only feebly express our sympathy for the general loss "and our best wishes for your renewed prosperity."

17. He has received and will, by direction of the Most Worshipful the Grand Master, lay before grand lodge a letter from W. Bro. Ramon Illa, of New York, representative at large, requesting recognition of the recently constituted Grand Lodge of the Island of Cuba, and the establishment of friendly and fraternal relations. The letter is accompanied by printed minutes of the proceedings had at the formation of this grand lodge, and of matters in connection therewith.

18. The destruction of about two thousand copies of constitutions in his office will render it obligatory upon grand lodge to authorize the publication of another edition, especially as the constitution requires [Sept.

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that every candidate on his initiation shall be presented with a copy, and the Grand Secretary should be in a position to furnish copies to lodges when called upon.

19. He has also to state that nearly four hundred copies of the funeral service were lost, and to ask the consideration of grand lodge as to the advisability of ordering another supply.

20. By authority of the Most Worshipful the Grand Master, duplicates of the warrants of the lodges destroyed by the fire have been engrossed. Happily, in the years gone by, he opened and kept a book in which he entered copies of all warrants issued by grand lodge, and was thus enabled to furnish the lodges with exact copies of those lost. The signatures of the officers who signed the originals are appended to those copies. They are thus fac similies, and are almost as valuable as the originals.

21. As all the copies of the proceedings of grand lodge, from the date of its organization up to the present time have been destroyed, the Grand Secretary respectfully calls upon grand lodge to authorize him to contract for the publication of a reprint.

He submitted this matter to the Board of General Purposes, and the board authorized the president to recommend, in the annual report, the publication of a reprint, to the favorable consideration of grand lodge.

He desires that the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick should occupy a position co-equal with sister grand lodges in every respect, and that it should be ready at all times to reciprocate any favors which may be bestowed upon it.

Continual calls are made upon him for back copies of our proceedings to replenish the shelves of masonic libraries, or to supply lost or missing numbers in the offices of other grand secretaries. These calls he has heretofore responded to cheerfully and promptly, as other grand secretaries have done when he has had occasion to ask for their proceedings. A reprint of our proceedings must be issued sooner or later, and the present is the best and most opportune time.

He is well aware that the issue of a book of some six hundred pages, requiring the reading and correcting of proofs, and the general superintendance of the work, will heap a large amount of extra labor upon his shoulders, yet, nevertheless, he is willing to bear the whole of it in the interests and for the credit of grand lodge.

#### REPORT OF THE BOARD OF GENERAL PURPOSES.

## MASONIC HALL, ST. JOHN, N. B., 26th Day of September, A. L. 5877.

To the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick:

1. The Board of General Purposes in presenting their annual report for 1876 and 1877 are under the painful necessity of referring to the death of the late Deputy Grand Master, R. W. Bro. W. H. A. Keans, so long an active and devoted member of the craft, and at the time of his death the President of the Board. Honored by the community in which he lived for so many years with various positions of trust, rendering the City of St. John important services in the legislature of the province, discharging every duty faithfully, earnestly, and care-

fully, our Right Worshipful Brother left behind him an honorable record and one that will long live in the memory of all who knew him.

- 2. At the first meeting after the close of grand lodge last year, Worshipful Bro. J. Henry Leonard was chosen Vice-President of the board by an unanimous vote.
- 3. The board called for tenders for printing the proceedings of the past year, and for the funeral service. By this means some slight reduction in the price of printing was secured, the contract still remaining with Messrs. Chubb & Co. The usual number of copies of the proceedings (five hundred) was printed, and distributed in the customary way by the Grand Secretary.
- 4. The board, early in the year, appointed a committee to make rules and regulations for the administration of the fund of benevolence. But the committee, after some deliberation, recommended that it would not be advisable to draw upon even the interest of the fund until the principal should reach two thousand dollars; and as this day is yet distant they thought it not advisable at the present to make any rules. While upon this point the board respectfully urges the importance of this fund upon the consideration of grand lodge, and suggests that such allowance may be made to it as grand lodge may feel able to spare permanently from its treasury. The amount granted last year was two hundred dollars and this sum has been placed to the credit of the fund.
- 5. The proper dispositon of the surplus funds of grand lodge early occupied the attention of the board, and a committee was appointed to consider the "best means of depositing and making the funds available." That committee reported as follows:—

## To the Board of General Purposes of Grand Lodge:

The committee on grand lodge funds report that the balance shown in the annual report of the Grand Treasurer for the past year, \$1,185.93, which was in the Bank of British North America in the name of B. Lester Peters, William Wedderburn, and Wm. H. A. Keans, has since the death of R. W. Bro. Keans, been withdrawn and deposited again in the same bank in the names of B. Lester Peters, William Wedderburn, and James McNichol, Jr., the present Grand Treasurer, to be withdrawn on the check of any two of them.

Your committee are of opinion that the present mode of deposit is the most available way of keeping such funds of grand lodge as are required to meet ordinary charges and expenses, but that it is desirable from time to time as may be found practicable to invest at interest any funds of grand lodge not required to be drawn upon.

They recommend that five hundred dollars of the funds of grand lodge be now invested in a public debenture bearing six per cent interest, to be approved by the board.

Resolved, That the report of the board be received and lie on the table, and further, that the address of the grand master, and the reports of the grand secretary, grand treasurer and board of general purposes be printed for the immediate use of grand lodge.

The library committee submitted a report, which, on motion of R. W. Bro. B. Lester Peters, P. G. M., was ordered to be received.

#### REPORT OF LIBRARY COMMITTEE.

To the Grand Lodge of F. & A. M. of New Brunswick :

The library committe report, that in consequence of the loss of the library and all papers and documents in connection therewith, in the fire of June 20th last, they have very little data to base a report upon. They expected to have been in a position to come before grand lodge at this annual session with a full and interesting statement of the progress they had made in the work committed to their charge; to have presented a descriptive catalogue of all the works possessed by grand lodge, reaching up to some three hundred and fifty volumes in number, and also to have made a report upon the future disposition of the library.

Unfortunately in their present predicament they may be likened to a coat without tails, collar, sleeves, body and buttons.

As is well known to grand lodge, the books belonging to the library were kept in the Grand Secretary's office, awaiting the time when suitable rooms could be properly fitted up for their reception.

At the time of the fire there were some seventy volumes in the bindery of Messrs. H. Chubb & Co.'s book binding establishment getting bound preparatory to being added to those in the Grand Secretary's office. These were likewise destroyed. Grand Lodge has, therefore, not a vestige of the library remaining.

Of the amount of insurance which grand lodge will eventually receive (some seven hundred dollars) more than one half was effected upon the library and should be set aside and placed to the credit of the library fund to enable the future library committee to make good the loss, as far as it may be possible to do so.

When they submitted their report last year the sum of \$5.95 was due them; since then they have drawn one hundred dollars, placed at their disposal by vote of grand lodge.

As the book in which the library account was kept shared in the general destruction, they find it impossible to furnish a statement of the amount expended or the balance which remains to the credit of the fund. As far, however, as memory will serve, there should be some twenty-five or thirty dollars in the hands of the committee.

They hope and trust that before another twelve months roll around, and grand lodge shall again assemble in annual communication, the unpleasant nightmare of June 20th will have taken itself away and relieved us of all the ill consequences of its present memories.

Among the accessories to this much-to-be-hoped-for state of things, as far as the craft in this jurisdiction is interested, the energetic re-establishment of the library may be confidently named as one of the most important.

He stated, that the flames of the destructive conflagration had scarcely been subdued, and while the whole burnt district was a smoking and smouldering area, telegrams and letters came pouring in from the east, the west, the north and the south, addressed to the Grand Master and himself, from Grand Masters, Grand Secretaries, Masters of lodges and private members of the craft, expressive of fraternal condolence and sympathy with those of our fraternity who were sufferers by the fire, and with tenders of material aid in the hour of their adversity.

Some telegrams authorized the Grand Master to draw for sums of one thousand dollars and less, some made enquiries as to the losses, etc., of the craft, and some gave promises of early remittances—all, however, conveying sympathetic and fraternal expressions, and giving the most undoubted proof that the heart of the craft, both far and near, was deeply touched and unmistakably moved toward our stricken city and suffering brotherhood.

He stated further, that immediately after the fire the M. W. the Grand Master convened a meeting of the city members of the board of general purposes and the presiding officers of all the masonic bodies in Saint John, which resulted in the formation of a board of relief.

After its organization, the board finding that our brethren at a distance, who wished to forward remittances, were at a loss to know whom to address, and finding, also, that sums were being sent to parties not anthorized to receive and disburse them, issued a circular to the Grand Secretaries of all Grand Lodges in the United States, the Dominion of Canada and the mother country, of which the following is a copy:

# GRAND LODGE F. & A. M. OF NEW BRUNSWICK, OFFICE OF GRAND SECRETARY, St. John, 7th July, 1877.

B. W. AND DEAR BROTHER,-

The telegraph wires and the public newspapers have announced to the world the terrible calamity which befell the city of Saint John on the 20th day of June, ultimo, by which the largest and most valuable portion of our city was reduced to ashes, and the majority of the inhabitants rendered homeless—very icw of them saving even a portion of their personal or household effects.

Among the victims was a large portion of the masonic fraternity.

In order to afford aid and shelter to our suffering brethren, a general masonic board of relief has been organized, composed of the city members of the board of general purposes of grand lodge, and the presiding officers of the masonic todies of all grades.

Thus composed, the board extends its helping hand to the sufferers of all degrees of freemasonry, and insures a regular and systematic mode of dispensing the funds placed at its disposal. The officers of the board are: -

This circular was not issued for the purpose of soliciting assistance, but to inform the fraternity of the existence of a regularly established board, and to name to them the brother authorized to receive their voluntary aid and free-will contributions.

That it needed no special appeal to awaken the sympathies, or to open wide the benevolent heart of the craft, or to prove the universality of freemasonry, and the unbounded extent of masonic charity, the following list of unsolicited contributions received up to the present date, will amply prove:—

This amount will, in all probability, be largely increased by additional contributions which have been promised from several localities.

Up to the present time the sum of two thousand six hundred and sixty-nine dollars (\$2,669.00) has been disbursed in the relief of all worthy cases reported to the board.

In order the better to carry out the objects of the board and to simplify and facilitate the distribution of the funds placed at its disposal, a sub-committee of five was appointed with full power to grant relief. This committee met (and continues to meet) on stated days of each week, in a room rented for the purpose, in the city market building. This room is continuously open during business hours, where applications for relief can be made and every information afforded by the brother appointed to act as clerk to the board.

The board has deemed it prudent to reserve as large a portion of the fund as possible for the coming winter, as, no doubt, at that rigorous season of the year, much distress and privation will prevail, and the resources of the board will in consequence be tested to their utmost.

The work entrusted to the board will probably be brought to a ter-

mination before the next annual communication of grand lodge, at which time, no doubt, a full report of its proceedings will be presented.

The following resolution was moved by R. W. Bro. Robert Marshall, P. D. G. M., and adopted:—

Resolved, That the information given by the Grand Secretary in regard to the doings of the board of relief, be embodied in the printed proceedings;

And further Resolved, That the warmest thanks of grand lodge be recorded to all who have so nobly contributed to alleviate the distress and suffering of the masonic victims of the recent fire.

Previous to closing, the M. W. the Grand Master expressed his gratification to the brethren for their attention to the business of the session and for the harmony which prevailed. He alluded to the unfavorable circumstances under which grand lodge met, and ventured a hope that the next session would bring with it a brighter and more cheerful state of things.

Grand Lodge was thereupon closed in ample form.
