The M. W. the Grand Master delivered his Annual Address as follows:

GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS.

R. W. D. Grand Master, Grand Wardens, and Brethren:

In the discharge of duty, most pleasurable duty too, we meet once more in Grand Lodge and exchange with each other warm fraternal greetings. To many of us it is, no doubt, a sincere pleasure that for a brief period of time we can escape from the contentions which divide men, from the strife of the outer world, and in the true spirit of our ancient Brotherhood learn how best to work and best to agree in that labor which is for the benefit of all humanity.

Our relations with all the foreign Grand Lodges with which we are in correspondence are of the most fraternal character. With the Grand Lodge of Ohio, of Pennsylvania, and of Washington Territory, we have established closer bonds of friendship and amity, and no doubt you will cordially greet the Representatives of these distinguished bodies when they present here their credentials. I have appointed as our Representative at the Grand Lodge of Washington Territory W. Bro. Hanford W. Fairweather, P. G. J. W. of that Grand Lodge and a native of this Province; and at that of Pennsylvania, R.W. Bro. Joseph Eichbaum, the present Deputy Grand Master of that great State; and I am confident that whatever interests may be committed to these eminent brethren in our behalf will be carefully guarded by them.

The most important question troubling the Masonic world on this continent is that arising out of the condition of things in the Province of Quebec. Papers on this matter will be laid on the table of Grand Lodge by the Grand Secretary. There are yet some Lodges existing in Quebec on the registry of the Grand Lodge of England, and it is claimed that these Lodges are clandestine and irregular, inasmuch as Quebec is a territory within the jurisdiction of a regularly formed Grand Lodge. It will be recollected that what are now Quebec and Ontario were formerly the Province of Canada; that a Grand Lodge was formed for that Province, and was recognized throughout the Masonic world as a lawful Masonic power; that at the political Confederation of the Provinces Quebec was set apart as a province of the Confederation, and the members of the craft there claimed the right to establish a Grand Lodge for themselves, and did establish a Grand Lodge against the authority

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of the Grand Lodge of Canada, of which their lodges were constituents, and to which they owed allegiance. Our Grand Lodge declined to recognize the Quebec Grand Lodge until it was recognized by the Grand Lodge of Canada, inasmuch as it appeared to us that the territory was Masonically occupied by the Grand Lodge of Canada. This view was set out by R. W. Bro. B. L. Peters, who was Grand Master in 1870, in one of the ablest papers ever written upon the subject, and was maintained by Grand Lodge. Finally the difficulty was arranged by the parties interested : the Grand Lodge of Canada recognized the Grand Lodge of Quebec, and this Grand Lodge was of course very glad to do the same, the party most interested having surrendered its jurisdiction over the territory. But when the Grand Lodge of Canada was formed, and during its existence, it, by arrangement with the Grand Lodge of England, recognized the existence of English lodges in Quebec-or, as it was then termed, Canada East, - and it in part waived its jurisdiction so far as these lodges were concerned; and so long as it continued authority over Canada East (or Quebec), these lodges had rights by their original constitution and by the waiver already referred to. We recognized this condition of things by entering into fraternal relations with the Grand Lodge of Canada as she existed, with these lodges in her territory but not holding from her. The Grand Lodge of Canada continues to recognize this yet, although she is not in the territory. She only abandoned to the Grand Lodge of Quebec the rights in the territory she herself had. When we recognized the Grand Lodge of Quebec in the way we did we recognized just what the Grand Lodge of Canada recognized, and it seems to us that we need take no action now. Further than this, we practically recognized the right of these English lodges to exist inasmuch as we did not demand when we recognized the Grand Lodge of Canada, and subsequently the Grand Lodge of Quebec, that they should cease to exist. On the contrary, our members and their members have constantly fraternized. I feel bound to add, however, my earnest hope that the difficulty may be arranged. It would be in the interest of harmony and brotherhood that the strife this matter has produced should cease. There is, from our point of view, no question of principle involved. The Grand Lodge of England stands justly enough on the compact made with the Grand Lodge of Canada, and asks that the compact be respected. Quebec denies that she is bound by that compact. It is surely a matter for peaceful settlement, in the spirit of Freemasonry, and not a cause for the issue of fierce

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manifestoes, for violent denunciations, and the withdrawal of friendly relations. If Freemasonry cannot settle its difficulties on its own principles and by friendly arbitration, what are we to expect of the armed nations?

A matter which has been brought before me more than once during the year has reference to the point whether or not a brother belonging to a lodge in this jurisdiction and resident here has the right to withdraw from membership and unite with a lodge in Maine, or in Nova Scotia, or elsewhere. It appears that in the County of Charlotte some brothers, after they are raised, withdraw and join the lodge at Eastport, in the neighboring State of Maine, which is more convenient to attend than their mother lodge. I sympathize with the aggrieved lodges, but I know of no remedy. I think the absolute right of a brother in good standing to withdraw from a lodge is recognized by all Masonic authority, and I know of no law to prevent him from joining a lodge anywhere. However, as the matter is of special importance to one lodge, and as it is a matter of principle, I bring it before you for your consideration, as you may view the matter in a different light from that in which I view it.

The reports which will be laid before Grand Lodge by the Grand Secretary, the Grand Treasurer, and the Board of General Purposes will furnish ample information upon the state of the craft in the jurisdiction. Financially there is an improved condition of things, and we are easily meeting all our engagements. Numerically we have lost more members than I anticipated we would lose in the past year. There are fewer suspensions for non-payment of dues than in 1884-5, but there is an increase in deaths and withdrawals, and a decrease in the number of admissions, both by initiation and by members re-joining. In some, if not all, of the lodges the policy prevails of getting members who are in arrears of and negligent about their dues to pay up a portion of their indebtedness, as a payment in full, and then to withdraw. The advantage of this is that these brethren go out of active membership in good standing as craftsmen. The disadvantage is that it leads to the unaffiliation of members who are somewhat indifferent, but who might be kept on the books in good standing by a little judicious management on the part of the Secretaries. An efficient and earnest Secretary who will take an interest in keeping up the lodge, by collecting the dues as a matter of business, should not make haste to get brethren to withdraw who are in arrears. Of course the tax imposed by Grand Lodge has an influence in inducing the private lodges to pursue this course. On this point the following figures may be of interest:

Is there any way by which the number of withdrawals and suspensions can be reduced? It might be possible to devise a plan by which many brothers now under suspension for nonpayment of dues could be restored to membership without Grand Lodge requiring to be paid the full charge per capita for the time the suspension existed, and the withdrawals might be lessened if Grand Lodge could commute the annual charges in cases where brothers commute their annual payments to their lodges. I have no definite plan, but I commend the matter to the attention of Grand Lodge as one deserving of its most serious consideration. Not only is it a financial loss to have so many members taken from us, but we lose their sympathy, their fellowship, their support in most of our works.

Early in the present year a difficulty arose in St. John's Lodge in this city of a somewhat serious nature, involving, however, no question of morals. I referred the complaints made to the Board of General Purposes for advice. There was a long and patient investigation of all the matters in dispute. The Board, after many sittings, reached certain conclusions, which it communicated to me, and which materially assisted me in the final arrangement and disposal of the difficulty. As the representative of the craft, I am deeply indebted to the members of the Board for the very great pains which they took, and which required a great deal of valuable time. I refer to this subject, not to bring up matters which are better left in obscurity, but to direct attention to one point on which there was a conclusion, on a clause of the Constitution of Grand Lodge, which ought to be made public:

"Section 6.—If the Master be not present the immediate Past Master, or if he be not present, the senior Past Master of the lodge present shall take the chair."

The practice has generally prevailed that the Worshipful Master of a lodge before or on a night of meeting, regular or emergent, could request any Past Master (generally, however,

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of his own lodge) to take the chair in his absence, and the brother so requested to act as Master sat in the East unquestioned as to his right. This question was involved in the difficulties which arose, and the Board held "That the Worshipful Master has not the constitutional right to depute any Past Master to take the chair in his absence, to the exclusion of the Immediate Past Master or the Senior Past Master present." I accepted this view of the written law, the only section of the Constitution on which an opinion was involved. I report the decision to Grand Lodge as one of some importance to the craft here, in view of the prevailing practice.

Lebanon Lodge, No. 29, Sackville, not having met for some time, R. W. Bro. G. M. Jarvis, G. J. W., at my request visited the brethren, and had a conference with them as to the advisability of surrendering the warrant. The conclusion he reached was that there was no hope of continuing the work, and he advised me accordingly. The lodge is not able to discharge the simple duty of burying its deceased members, and brethren who have moved away from Sackville and are seeking dimits, have not been able to obtain them. The Grand Secretary has had considerable correspondence with W. Bro. Phinney, who is an earnest Mason and desirous of keeping the working tools bright, but he seems to have little assistance. Some of the brethren recently came together, however, and decided to make a final effort to revive the lodge. I would ask Grand Lodge to remit any amount that may be outstanding on the Grand Lodge dues of the Lodge for the years 1883 and 1884, provided those for 1885 are paid with reasonable promptitude, and that the lodge resumes work within the present year.

Among the many duties which I have discharged as Grand Master, the most pleasing was that of visitation. During the year, in addition to official visits to lodges meeting in this Hall, I have visited Lodge St. Andrew, Richibucto; Northumberland Lodge, Newcastle; Restigouche Lodge, Dalhousie; Campbellton Lodge, Campbellton; Miramichi Lodge, Chatham; and Hiram Lodge, Fredericton. The lodges at the North Shore were visited in the early winter; but whatever there was of discomfort in the travel was amply made up by the kindness and hospitality of the brethren. At Richibucto, Campbellton, Chatham, Dalhousie, and Bathurst the brethren displayed the social virtues in the most marked degree in their entertainment, and indeed everywhere we were very kindly received. Accompanying me from St. John were R. W. Bro. Logan, the Deputy Grand Master, who had the arrangements in his charge,

and who successfully carried them out; W. Bro. Johnston, of Hibernia Lodge; Bro. R. C. Thorne, of St, John's Lodge; W. Bro. John A. Watson, Grand Director of Ceremonies; and Bro. Alex. Morrison, of New Brunswick Lodge. The Senior Grand Warden, R. W. Bro. E. Lee Street, met us at Richibucto, and accompanied us almost entirely through the round of visits, shewing us many courtesies; and for a part of the time we had the company of Worshipful Brother John Taylor, Grand Sword Bearer, of Richibucto. Several of the brethren of the lodges we visited accompanied us a part of the distance, visiting other lodges with us, and it was a pleasure to meet so many worthy and generous Masons. At some of the meetings degrees were conferred by the Grand Lodge officers, at others we inspected the work. In the visit to Hiram Lodge, Fredericton, made a few weeks ago, I was accompanied by a large number of the craft from St. John. We met a most hearty welcome, and spent an evening long to be remembered with pleasure by hosts and guests. Everywhere we found that our craft is in the hands of competent, generous, spirited Masons. The work was generally well done, and in some cases it called for nothing but commendation.

Although we do not progress in numbers in this Province, our position is not discouraging, and with the continuance of harmony we may hope, with improved times, to surmount whatever difficulties now lie in our path.

I commend to the careful and prudent consideration of Grand Lodge whatever questions may arise, advising, as I have ever done, to proceed *slowly* in the consideration of all things, and to take no step in any matter which does not commend itself fully to our best judgment. Thus we have acted in the past, and to this must be attributed, under Divine Providence, the success which has attended us since we became a united jurisdiction.

On motion of R. W. Bro. James McNichol, Jr., P. D. G. M., it was

Resolved, That the Address of the Grand Master be referred to a special committee to report upon the several questions contained therein.

Which committee was appointed as follows: R. W. Bro. James McNichol, Jr., W. Bro. Harry Beckwith, W. Bro. J. T. Whitlock, R. W. Bro. Thomas A. Godsoe, and W. Bro. Wm. G. Disbrow, M. D.

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The Grand Secretary called the roll of Grand Representatives. The following Grand Lodges were represented: Canada, England, Indiana, Ireland, Michigan, Scotland, Wisconsin, Louisiana, Wyoming.

None of the above representatives had anything particular to communicate from their respective Grand Lodges.

The V. W. the Grand Secretary presented his Annual Report and Account, as follows:

REPORT OF GRAND SECRETARY.

To the Grand Lodge of F. & A. M. of New Brunswick:

The Grand Secretary begs leave to submit his Annual Report and Account to the 27th April, 1886.

1. The receipts of my Office since the last Annual Communication amount to two thousand four hundred and forty-two dollars and eighty-one cents, upon the following accounts:

4. One hundred and two certificates were issued during the year to brethren entitled to them under the Constitution.

5. On the 26th May I received from the Grand Lodge of Manitoba, notice of the death of R. W. Bro. Colonel William Hassan Kennedy, Past Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Manitoba, who died in England on the 3rd day of May, A. D. 1885. He was overtaken by the dread messenger on his way home from Egypt, whither he had gone to serve under his country's flag.

6. A communication was received, dated 20th May, from V. W. Bro. George P. Cleaves, Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of New Hampshire, stating that Bro. Rev. C. W. Dockrill, of Marlboro, N. H., who was initiated into Freemasonry in Leinster Lodge, No. 19 (now dormant), is desirous of receiving the F. C. and M. M. Degrees in Social Friends Lodge of their jurisdiction, and fraternally asking us to relinquish jurisdiction over him.

By direction of the M.W. the Grand Master, Grand Secretary Cleaves was informed that Bro. Dockrill was a member of late Leinster Lodge, and if he obtained a dimit now through Grand Lodge we would not consider we had any further claim upon him.

7. A dimit was granted to Bro. Andrew Reed, formerly a member of late Leinster Lodge, No. 19, he having paid all demands against him for dues. Bro. Reed is now residing in the United States.

8. June 23, a circular was received from the Grand Lodge of Federal District, U.S. of Mexico, dated 23rd May, 1885, claiming that their Grand Lodge holds jurisdiction through all that district, and that they are the only lawful and recognized Grand Lodge, and requesting recognition by the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick at its next Communication.

Papers were received from the Grand Lodge of Lower California, Mexico, announcing the organization of that Grand Lodge on the 2nd day of June, A. D. 1884, with an earnest 1886] GRAND LODGE OF NEW BRUNSWICK. 65

request that this Grand Lodge will extend fraternal communication, and exchange representatives.

The Grand Lodge of Colon and Island of Cuba issued a circular stating that having resigned the territory of the Island of Porto Rico, over which it had jurisdiction since 1859, that a Grand Lodge for that district was constituted in the City of Mayagnez, founded by the existing twelve chartered Lodges, and fraternal relations had been established with this new Grand Lodge; with a request that all Grand Lodges will extend the same fraternal feeling.

A circular was received from the Grand Lodge of the State of Jaliseo, U. S. of Mexico, dated 15th December, requesting fraternal relations with the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick.

All these papers were handed to the Committee on Relations with Foreign Grand Lodges.

9. August 19th. Received from the Grand Lodge of Quebec an Edict issued by the M. W. the Grand Master, declaring and proclaiming all Lodges holding allegiance to any Foreign Grand Lodge to be Masonically, irregularly, and illegally existing in that Province, and proclaiming all Masonic intercourse to be suspended, and to cease between that Grand Lodge, its subordinate Lodges, and all brethren in obedience thereto, and such other Lodges and all members in obedience thereto holding allegiance to any Foreign Grand Lodge.

On the 16th November another circular was received, giving the names of Lodges under English Registry that have refused to acknowledge the Grand Lodge of Quebec; also an Edict from the Grand Lodge of the State of Illinois concerning the relations of that Grand Lodge to Lodges outside of the Grand Lodge of Quebec. These papers will be placed before Grand Lodge.

10. A circular was received from the Grand Lodge of Virginia, dated at Richmond, June 15th, 1885, announcing the death of R. W. Bro. John Farran Reynault, Grand Treasurer. He was an honored member of the Craft.

July 22, I received the sad news of the death of R. W. Bro. Aurelia Almeida, Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Colon and Island of Cuba, who died on the 25th June. Bro. Almeida was an energetic and painstaking officer.

March 29th, 1886. Notice was received of the death of R. W. Bro. William H. Root, Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Vermont, who died on the 11th March. Bro. Root was an upright citizen, a man of unswerving integrity, and of

earnest devotion to the cause of Freemasonry. R. W. Bro. Lavant M. Reid was appointed Grand Secretary until the next Annual Communication.

11. A commission was received from the Grand Lodge of Washington, dated 12th February, 1886, appointing R. W. Bro. Wm. J. Logan Representative of that Grand Lodge near the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick. Signed, Louis Zieglar, Grand Master; T. M. Reed, Grand Secretary.

A commission was also received for R. W. Bro. Thomas A. Godsoe, as Representative of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania near this Grand Lodge, dated March 4th, 1886. Signed, E. Coppee Mitchell, Grand Master.

These commissions have been handed to R. W. Brothers Logan and Godsoe, to be duly presented by them at this Session of Grand Lodge.

12. By order of the M. W. the Grand Master, a Commission was issued under the Seal of Grand Lodge to Bro. Hanford W. Fairweather, authorizing him to act as the Representative of this Grand Lodge near the Grand Lodge of Washington.

13. The supply of parchment Certificates having become exhausted, an order was given R. W. Bro. Alex. Hay, of Edinburgh, Scotland, for two hundred and fifty copies. Bro. Hay attended to this duty with great promptness and had them struck off and forwarded to me.

14. The Board of General Purposes has filed in my office a notice with a proposition to amend the book of Constitutions, notice of which has been furnished to all members in the Circular for this Annual Communication.

Arrangements were made with the Intercolonial, New Brunswick, and Grand Southern Railways, by which brethren attending Grand Lodge at this Communication can come and return by the payment of one first-class fare. Upon application I will furnish a Certificate to return free on the Intercolonial and Grand Southern Railways. The ticket furnished for those brethren travelling on the New Brunswick Road is all that is required for the return trip.

There has been considerable correspondence with Lodges on a variety of matters, but none of it is of sufficient importance to refer to specially.

The R. W. the Deputy Grand Master, as President of the Board of General Purposes, submitted the annual report of the Board, as follows:

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF GENERAL PURPOSES.

ST. JOHN, N. B., April 20th, 1886.

To the Grand Lodge of F. & A. M. of New Brunswick:

The Board of General Purposes beg to submit their annual report, which is as follows:

At their first meeting, held on the 6th of May, 1885, W. Bro. W. R. Russell, Past Master of New Brunswick Lodge, No. 22, was unanimously elected Vice-President. It was also agreed to hold four regular meetings during the year, viz., on the first Wednesday in August, November, February and April.

In reference to the matter of Deputy District Grand Masters, referred to the Board by Grand Lodge at its last Annual Session, it was ordered that the whole matter be referred to a committee, who, having given the subject due and full consideration, submitted the following report, which was received and adopted by the Board, and the Board recommend that the Constitution of Grand Lodge be amended in accordance therewith.

DISTRICT DEPUTY GRAND MASTERS.

1st. The jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge shall be divided into five Districts, for each of which a District Deputy Grand Master shall be chosen, as hereinafter provided. These Districts shall be numbered as follows:

No. 1. To include the City and County of Saint John and Counties of Kings and Queens.

No. 2. To include the Counties of Westmorland and Albert. No. 3. To include the Counties of Kent, Northumberland, Gloucester and Restigouche.

No. 4. To include the Counties of York, Carleton, Victoria, Madawaska and Sunbury.

No. 5. To include the County of Charlotte.

2nd. The District Deputy Grand Master for each District shall be nominated by the majority of the members of Grand Lodge belonging to the lodges in such District, who may be present at each Annual Communication, and if confirmed by the Grand Master, if present, he shall be regularly installed. He must be a Past Master and a resident in the District for which he is appointed; provided, however, that for the District in which the Deputy Grand Master for the time being resides, no District Deputy Grand Master shall be chosen, but the duties of that office shall be discharged by the Deputy Grand Master, without prejudice to his rank or precedence.

3rd. The District Deputy Grand Master may preside in every lodge he officially visits within his District, with the Master of the lodge on his right hand.

4th. Each District Deputy Grand Master shall examine carefully into the condition of the lodges under his charge, examine their records and correct any irregularities therein, point out all errors in their manner of working, instruct them in every particular where he thinks information is required, recommend attention to the moral and benevolent principles of Masonry, caution in the admission of candidates, punctual attendance at all meetings, and representation at every Annual

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Communication of Grand Lodge, and report to the Grand Master in writing the state of each lodge in his District at least one month prior to each Annual Communication.

The Senior Warden of St. John's Lodge, No. 2, having protested against certain proceedings of the Lodge, the M. W. the Grand Master directed the Grand Secretary to place the whole matter before the Board, with the request that they would carefully examine into all the circumstances and make such reports therein as the facts and laws of Grand Lodge and the Constitution of the Fraternity may warrant. The Board, having given the whole matter their most careful consideration, arrived at certain conclusions, which they respectfully submitted to the Most Worshipful the Grand Master.

In accordance with the direction of Grand Lodge, the Board has prepared and herewith present the following Constitutional amendment in reference to the Centennial Medal:

"In addition to the other jewels prescribed by the laws of Grand Lodge, every brother who was a member of the Craft in this Province in the year 1884 will be entitled to wear the Centennial Medal in bronze, which was struck in commemoration of the introduction of Freemasonry into New Brunswick, and the dies for which are in the custody of the Grand Secretary."

In reference to the finances of Grand Lodge, the Board has much pleasure in calling the attention of the Craft to the following very satisfactory report:

To the Board of General Purposes of the Grand Lodge. F. & A. M.:

Your Committee beg to report that they have audited the books and accounts of the Grand Treasurer and Grand Secretary for the past Masonic year, and have much pleasure in stating that they find the accounts correct, and the books kept in a neat and systematic manner.

REPORT OF THE LIBRARY COMMITTEE.

To the Grand Lodge of F. & A. M. of New Brunswick:

The Library Committee beg to submit a report:

Immediately after the last Communication of Grand Lodge the Committee met for organization, and elected Worshipful Brother T. Nisbet Robertson chairman.

The first matter which presented itself for the consideration of the Committee was the one suggested by the Grand Master in his last Annual Address, viz., whether the Library could not be made available to the Craft in general. On consultation with the Directors of the Masonic Hall Company they offered to the Library Committee a room in the building, free of rent for five years, on condition that the Committee should finish it at their own expense. This offer the Committee accepted, and at once commenced the finishing and fitting up of the Room. An appeal was made to the Masonic Hall Committee, which had an amount of money on hand after paying all expenses up to the time of its dissolution and the taking over of the rooms in this building by the Company. The Hall Committee unanimously resolved to hand over to the Library Committee the sum then in their hands, amounting to Ninety Dollars, which was done at once. A sub-committee of the Library Committee was appointed to visit the several Bodies meeting in this Building, to explain the position of the Library and solicit contributions to finish the Room and defray the cost of keeping the Library in running order. The Committee are pleased to be able to report that all the Bodies received the sub-committee in the most friendly manner, and each Body contributed the sum of Twenty Dollars towards the object named.

The Committee at once proceeded to have the Room finished, and, on its completion, the books and papers were removed from R. W. Bro. Bunting's office, where they had been kept through the kindness of Bro. Bunting ever since the Library was founded, and placed in the Room prepared for them.

The Committee appointed Bro. G. Gordon Boyne Librarian, and adopted a resolution that the Room should be kept open on each evening on which a meeting was held in the Lodge Room. This has been done, and the Committee are pleased to know that many Brethren have availed themselves of the opportunity offered to peruse the books and papers.

With regard to recognition of the several bodies claiming Grand Lodge jurisdiction in Mexico, the Committee beg to recommend that these applications be permitted to lie over until Grand Lodge is advised that more united action with regard to Grand jurisdiction in Mexico has been reached by these organizations.

With regard to the application by the Grand Lodge of Porto Rico: while the Committee might be able to recommend recognition of this Grand Lodge were they fully advised of all the negotiations and circumstances which led the United Grand Lodge of Colon and the Island of Cuba to resign its jurisdiction over the territory of the Island of Porto Rico, and the organization of this Grand Lodge, they beg to submit that the consideration of this application may well be permitted to lie over to the next session of Grand Lodge.

Hitherto the Company has received from Grand Lodge, annually, a Bond for \$500, in payment of stock formerly subscribed. The last Bond in payment of that subscription was issued last March, and by reference to the estimated income above it will be seen that that item does not appear, and that our receipts for the incoming year will be less by that amount (\$500).

It may be remarked that for the last couple of years the expenditure has been slightly within the income of the Company, owing to the receipt of the \$500 from Grand Lodge and the renting of the old lodge room to the Commissioners of the Public Library.

The estimates now shew, however, that for the incoming year there will be a deficiency of nearly \$300. The question then arises: In what way is this shortage to be met? Some1886] GRAND LODGE OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

thing must be done to keep the expenditure within the income; and your committee have given the matter the most careful consideration, with a view of recommending some plan that could be adopted to get over the difficulty. They have carefully examined the financial standing of Grand Lodge, to ascertain if it were possible to procure assistance from that source, without impairing the efficiency of Grand Lodge. This investigation has satisfied your committee that Grand Lodge can subscribe the further sum of \$5,000, and issue Bonds in payment, without in the least increasing the financial burden of the Craft.

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Your committee would therefore recommend that this Board take into earnest consideration the advisability of requesting Grand Lodge to subscribe that amount.

The Secretary has submitted vouchers for all expenditures during the year.

Your committee have much pleasure in reporting that they find the books and accounts of the Secretary-Treasurer kept in a satisfactory and efficient manner, and that he has in many ways, by counsel and advice, materially assisted the Directors in the management of the building.
