GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS

BRETHREN OF GRAND LODGE:

The Sixty-Seventh Annual Communication of this Grand Lodge opens amid peace and concord among the Craft but in a world in which unrest is yet the predominating factor. In our own jurisdiction there has been considerable relaxation of the pressure of economic necessity and I trust that we may during the coming year witness a return to conditions of reasonable comfort, though not yet, perhaps, to those of actual prosperity. It is good to be able to say, at least, that with us conditions are appreciably better and that the tide seems to be setting favorably towards us. It is to be noted that in this jurisdiction, despite the difficult period through which we have been passing, the demands upon our Fund of Benevolence have only slightly increased and yet no application has been refused. The principal

effect upon our Order has been a lack of increase in membership but I am satisfied that just as soon as times are decidedly better and money is more plentiful the Lodges will see large accessions to their rolls for there are many who desire to share in our mysteries who temporarily have been obliged to postpone their requests for admission.

VISITATIONS

The unusual severity of the winter accounts in part for the small number of visits paid to lodges outside of Saint John. The many snowfalls and unbroken roads in many of the country districts made it impossible for those members to attend who usually are present when there is a Grand Lodge visitation. On St. John's Day I installed the officers of Keith Lodge No. 23 at Moncton and in January of this year performed a like service for St. John's Lodge No. 2; Hibernia No. 3, New Brunswick No. 22, Corinthian No. 13 at Hampton and Lebanon No. 28 at Sackville. On

1st June I had the pleasure of meeting with the brethren of Hartland Lodge No. 46 at a very successful reunion and on the following evening visited Carleton Lodge No. 35 at East Florenceville. Both lodges showed lively interest in the work and the attendances were large. On 5th July I also visited Bethel Lodge No. 40 at Edmundston and the next evening, Colebrooke Lodge No. 39 at Grand Falls. Those lodges also showed evidence of great vitality and interest and I would say that their future is assured by the hearty efforts of those who are responsible for their direction. My last official visit was paid to Westmorland Lodge No. 44 at Port Elgin where I had opportunity to note the excellent quarters with which that lodge is provided and the general excellence of its work.

Besides these regular visitations I had the pleasure of being present at Albion Lodge No. 1 on 5th January on the occasion of an instructive address by Grand Master Harris of Nova Scotia on his attendance at the dedication of the Masonic Peace Memorial in England and incidents in his itinerary through that country.

CHURCH SERVICE

This year marks the 150th anniversary of the erection of New Brunswick into a Province and the event has recently been publicly celebrated with fitting eclat. Prior to the establishment of the Province there was a Masonic lodge in what was then the County of Sunbury, but the first lodge to be instituted in this jurisdiction since it became New Brunswick was Hiram Lodge No. 17, organized under a dispensation from Lodges 155 and 211 at Halifax and granted early in April 1784. The lodge was formally opened and installation of officers took place on 1st September 1784. The warrant to this lodge was dated at Halifax 6 December, 1786. It has long since passed out of existence but it was felt that it would be appropriate to commemorate the event by a celebration of Divine Service on 24th

June last. Accordingly Grand Lodge assembled at Trinity Church, St. John, on that date. All the city lodges were represented and there was a considerable attendance from other parts of the jurisdiction, over 200 members being present. The grand offices were occupied as follows:

An appropriate Masonic and historical sermon was preached by V. W. the Grand Chaplain, Rev. Walter P. Dunham and the clergy assisting in the service were R. W. Rev. C. Gordon Lawrence, Rector of Trinity, and Past Grand Chaplain, and Bro. the Rev. W. M. Martin of St. Mary's Church, Saint John.

FINANCES

I am sure that Grand Lodge will be pleased to note the healthy financial condition asserted by the report of the Grand Treasurer which shews a gradual and steady accession both to the general fund and to that of benevolence.

MEMBERSHIP

While the membership of the Order in this jurisdiction shews a slight decrease yet this is not unexpected in view of the conditions which have prevailed for some years. I am sure that Masonic charity has been liberally exercised by many lodges in keeping brethren on the roll during this trying period, and this is as it should be.

GENERAL OBSERVATIONS

In so far as I have been able to form impressions from my contact with the lodges in the jurisdiction, I feel that, if possible, there should be something more to interest members of Grand Lodge at our annual communications than the formal adoption of some reports and an election of officers. This year arrangements have been made for the exemplification of a degree and perhaps it would be well, in future, to have the three degrees worked. If this were thought to be somewhat tedious there should at least be an address by some competent speaker. It may be worth considering also, whether Grand Lodge might not, with benefit to the Craft, occasionally hold its meetings elsewhere than in the City of Saint John.

I find that the system instituted by my predecessor, of continuing in office the District Deputy Grand Masters has been productive of good results and I would suggest to my successor that he should continue the same policy. I would also suggest that the Grand Lodge visitations might, on occasion, be made by some of its principal officers, thus relieving the Grand Master to some extent, and possibly

enabling each lodge in the jurisdiction to be visited officially, each year. My very pleasant contact with a number of the lodges during my term of office has convinced me that such visits are much appreciated and constitute a useful stimulus to Masonry.

INVITATION

Grand Lodge has received an intimation that a formal invitation will be sent by the Grand Lodge of Scotland to its Bicentenary Celebration in 1936. I hope it may be possible to have Grand Lodge duly represented on this occasion.

In conclusion I desire to thank the many officers and members of the Craft who have contributed to make my two years of office so enjoyable. I have particularly to thank the R. W. the Grand Secretary and W. Bro. the Grand Director of Ceremonies without whose generous assistance my work could not have been so easily performed. To my successor in office and to the Craft in general, I desire to extend my best wishes for peace in which to continue their labors and health and prosperity in their exercise.

The Board recommends that the sum of \$2,000 of the present Cash Balance be invested and thus increase the Fund's Capital to \$66,000.

The Board has adopted a proposal. "That the actual expenses of a District Deputy Grand Master incurred in visiting Lodges up to the sum of \$25.00 be refunded to him on submitting a statement of the same to the Grand Secretary."

A supply of Grand Lodge Certificates being needed, an order for 300 was placed with the "British American Bank Note Company" of Ottawa which has the custody of our steel plate.

On executing the order, early in May, the company informed the Board that the plate shews distinct signs of wear and that if much further printing were done from it the plate would be beyond repair. The Company's engraving staff would do the repairing for approximately \$175.00.

The Board agreed that the work should be done provided that the Company would give the assurance that the plate when repaired, would be in a satisfactory printing condition for some years to come. The company has replied; "That we are in a position to state definitely that after the plate has been repaired the printing on the certificates will appear clearer and more definite than those supplied on your last order and we have every confidence that the plate will remain in satisfactory printing condition for many years to come." The repairing is, therefore, being taken in hand.

On behalf of the Committee on the Address of the M.W. Grand Master, R.W. Bro. G. Percy Burchill, submitted and read the following report and it was, on motion, duly adopted:

REPORT ON GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS.

To the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick:

Grand Lodge will most sincerely join with the Grand Master in his remarks referring to the relaxation of the pressure of economic necessity and trusts that his hope that the coming year may witness the return to conditions of reasonable comfort may be more than fulfilled. With the return of normal conditions it is to be hoped that the financial condition of Private Lodges will be improved and that those who have been denied temporarily sharing in the mysteries of the Fraternity, may be able to realize their ambition.

Grand Lodge will join in the expressions of regret occasioned by the passing of so many eminent members of the Grand Lodge since our last Annual Communication. Their removal from this temporal sphere is just one more reminder of how swiftly the sands run and how rapidly our lives are drawing to a close. We extend to the relatives of our departed Brethren, our sincere sympathy in their bereavement; and we recommend that suitable reference be made to their passing in the proceedings of Grand Lodge.

Grand Lodge notes with pleasure the Grand Master's reference to the dedication of the new Masonic Temple, owned and occupied by Salisbury Lodge No. 20, and congratulates our Brethren of Salisbury Lodge on the completion of their new home.

Grand Lodge regrets with the Grand Master that the unusual severity of the past winter prevented him from making as many visits to the private Lodges as he otherwise would have done and agrees with the Grand Master that frequent contacts between Grand Lodge and the Private Lodges are to be strongly commended as a useful stimulus to Masonry.

While appreciating the fact that the Grand Master may, on occasion, be relieved by his Deputy officers in these visits, we are doubtful as to whether this plan would be productive of as good results.

In spite of the economic conditions, we are happy to join with the Grand Master in noting the strong financial position of Grand Lodge as evidenced by the report of the Grand Treasurer; and once more voice our appreciation of those who direct the financial affairs of Grand Lodge.

With reference to the suggestion that the Annual Communications of Grand Lodge be held occasionally elsewhere than in Saint John, we desire to point out that it is competent for any Private Lodge to invite Grand Lodge to hold the Communication with them, in which event it would be a matter for Grand Lodge to decide.

We agree with the Grand Master that the continuing in office of the District Deputies has been productive of good results and trust that the practice will be maintained.

In the event of an invitation being received from the Grand Lodge of Scotland, to be represented at its bicentenary celebration in 1936, it is to be hoped that this Grand Lodge will be fittingly represented.

Grand Lodge reciprocates the good wishes of the M.W. Grand Master for peace, health and prosperity in the jurisdiction during the coming year.
