

# THOUSANDS PAY FINAL TRIBUTE TO JOHN THORNTON

Procession at Masonic Funeral Longest Seen Here in Years.

The first to die in the high office of Most Worshipful Grand Master of New Brunswick Free Masonry in the long history of that fraternity, John Thornton, age seventy, former city commissioner, prominent in business and the councils of the Conservative party, was buried in Fernhill Cemetery Sunday afternoon. Thousands honored his memory in the church service, cortege and along the public thoroughfares.

It was a demonstrative tribute to a citizen whose best years had been spent in the interests of the community. At St. Matthew's Presbyterian Church, Douglas Avenue, of which congregation Mr. Thornton had been treasurer for a number of years, an impressive service was conducted by the minister, Rev. Dr. J. A. Morison, assisted by Rev. W. C. V. Martin, rector of St. Mary's Anglican Church, as Very Worshipful Grand Chaplain of New Brunswick. Rev. E. J. Chisholm, pastor of Victoria Street United Baptist Church, also took part.

Alex. Cruikshank, organist and choirmaster, played the Scottish lament "Flowers of the Forest" as the coffin was being borne to the front of the pulpit and the hymns led by a selected choir and a Masonic male quartette, were, "Unto the Hills" and "Safe in the Arms of Jesus,"

Grand Chaplain Martin read the Scripture, Rev. Mr. Chisholm prayed and Dr. Morison delivered a brief eulogy upon Mr. Thornton, of whom he made reference as to usefulness of public life and worthy services as a church member. Dr. Morison concluded his remarks with quotations from Bryant and Whittier. The quartette—Messrs. Leonard Wilson, R. M. Seely, A. Clinton Regan and H. C. Marley—sang "The Old Rugged Cross."

#### GRAND LODGE PALLBEARERS

A Masonic funeral in full regalia, the procession was the longest and most comprehensive seen in this city in years. Besides Saint John Freemasons, there were representative groups from many sections of the Province, one officer from Quebec and members from Halifax.

Honorary pallbearers were the following: Right Worshipful Past Grand Masters LeBaron Wilson; J. Fred Edgett, Moncton; Stanley M. Wetmore; Chief Justice J. B. M. Baxter; Guy H. Humphrey, Hampton, and R. A. Gordon, of Prince Edward Island; and Past Grand Wardens Dr. Frank A. Godsoe and Henry D. Hopkins.

The active pallbearers were Past Worshipful Masters of Mr. Thornton's own lodge, New Brunswick No. 22: A. H. Campbell, Albert G. Hoar, Ernest H. Cameron, Frederick W. Barton, Ernest Law and J. Leonard Heans, also the incumbent Worshipful Master, Thomas G. Drake.

The following Saint John subordinate lodges with their officers and many members walked in the processional, wearing "Blue Lodge" aprons and official insignia—Hibernia Lodge No. 3 under the direction of Hilyard Steele, W. M.; Union Lodge of Portland No. 10, Reginald D. Barbour, W. M.; St. John's Lodge No. 2, William J. Bambury, W. M.; New Brunswick Lodge No. 22 (occupying a place of honor as special mourners because of Mr. Thornton's membership), Thomas G. Drake, W. M.; Albion Lodge No. 1, A. W. Thorne, W. M.; Carleton Union Lodge No. 8, J. L. MacCoubrey, I.P.M., and numerous officers and members from the community lodges in the lower section of the Province and some from distant

Immediately preceding the hearse officers and members of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick walked in a body in full regalia. In this group were: R. #### LANE OF BRETHREN

As the funeral procession reached Portland Street, the order to open ranks was given by James S. Hoyt, marshal. The lane extended to the corner of Douglas Avenue through which the hearse, accompanied by its double row of pallbearers and Grand Lodge escort, passed as the long line of

brethren bared their heads. Among civic officials were Mayor MacLaren and Councillors A. B. Gilbert and R. L. Grannan; the Mayor's secretary, A. G. Clinch, and H. D. Hopkins, the common clerk, one of the pallbearers. Heads of civic departments, including fire and police, honored the memory of their former chief official as well.

At Fernhill, Thomas G. Drake, W. M., of New Brunswick Lodge, assisted by Grand Chaplain Martin, read the committal and farewell of the Masonic Order and members of the craft stepped to the open grave dropping their mourning badges of crepe and sprigs of acacia upon the coffin. It was an impressive ceremony. Dr. Morison said the final prayer.

#### BLANKET OF FLOWERS

Other flowers in the blanket of blossoms that covered Mr. Thornton's grave were from the trustees and congregation of St. Matthew's Presbyterian Church; Cordage Distributors Ltd. of Canada, which the late Mr. Thornton had represented for years; W. H. Thorne & Co., Ltd.; Presbyterian Ladies' Club of St. Matthew's Church; Newman Brook Quoit Club; office staff of R. P. and W. F. Starr, Ltd.; St. Andrew's Soccer Club; Saint John District Soccer League; North End Improvement Association; St. Matthew's Church Sunday School; No. 2 Salvage Corps and Fire Police; collector and staff of the Customs and Excise, Port of Saint John.

Mr. Thornton was a member of St. John Lodge No. 30, Knights of Pythias, which was largely represented at the church service and in the cortege. The Knights expressed their esteem for their late brother in a large floral emblem. Several of the Masonic floral tokens were also emblematic. Private remembrances were numerous and telegrams of condolence and sympathy came from various parts of the Maritime Provinces and Masonic affiliations throughout Canada.

As Grand Master Thornton's body rested at Brenan's Funeral Home, Paradise Row, for several days, hundreds of callers signed the register.

#### ANNUAL MEETING

Saint John, N. B., August 22nd, 1940.

The Annual Meeting of "The Masonic Grand Lodge Corporation" was held this morning in the Masonic Temple, in the City of Saint John, at eleven o'clock, pursuant to notice given in the Proclamation summoning the Annual Communication of Grand Lodge.

The Statement set forth the Receipts and Expenditures on General Account and also of the Fund of Benevolence and a list of the Assets of the Fund. The Grand Treasurer's Statement had previously been considered and adopted by the Directors of the Corporation.

The Auditors, R:W: Bro. Roy E. Crawford; Wor. Bros. L. T. Allen and J. H. Crockett, submitted a detailed report as to the Accounts, and after the Report had been read a motion was made by R:W: H. A. Porter, seconded by R:W: H. D. Hopkins, and adopted:

"That the Accounts of the V:W: Grand Treasurer, and the Report of the Auditors, as printed and in the hands of the brethren, be received and adopted, and the recommendations of the Auditors be carried out; also that they be presented to Grand Lodge with a view of being printed in the Annual Proceedings of Grand Lodge."

Grand Lodge was opened in form and with solemn prayer by V:W: Brother Rev. W. C. V. Martin, Grand Chaplain. The Brethren joined in the reading of Psalm xxiv.

A short Memorial Service in respect to our late Most Worshipful Grand Master, John Thornton, was

conducted by the Grand Chaplain, V:W: the Rev. W. C. V. Martin.

The hymn, "Abide With Me" was sung and the Grand Chaplain read from the Book of Revelations, chapter 7, verses 9 to 17, and then delivered the following short address:—

#### THE LATE GRAND MASTER—JOHN THORNTON

We are gathered around this Masonic Altar today to pay tribute to our late esteemed and revered Grand Master, John Thornton.

This Service is unique in that it is the first time that a Grand Master has been called to the Celestial Lodge above while holding office.

He lived an active life, not only for Masonry and other fraternal Societies, but also for the Church he loved so well.

He also gave time to serve his fellow citizens in the Council of the City, thereby proving his worthiness as a man.

A familiar figure in Masonry; an ideal ritualist; a critic for good Masonry and the spirit of decorum; one who helped and assisted in any capacity for good and one who gave of his best in the office he was elected to by his brethren.

The whole trend of his heart and mind was for good. I think there can be no mistake in including him in that roll of tried and trusted Masons who died in the Lord and their works do follow them. I am sure he has been an inspiration to us as Masons.

In a certain Book these words occur: "There is no growth without roots." And it is as true of man as a tree. A tree cannot grow and be strong unless it is well rooted. Neither can a noble character be produced unless it is grounded and rooted in Him Who is the giver of all true life.

Yes! One believes he went down to the roots of reality and there he found his all sustaining power. One of the dreams of his Grand Mastership was a Grand Lodge Church Service, but it was not consummated owing to his illness. He knew that true Masonry must have the support and help of God.

John Thornton did not sit in the seat of the scornful. It was not in his nature to cast scorn upon others. His was a bright and bouyant disposition and he always endeavoured to spread hope and optimism instead of discouragement and gloom.

This was well known during his life of health and strength, and when the infirmity of the body began to work on him and his powers weakened he still maintained his courage to the end.

He was no complainer. Quietly and with dignity he carried through his work and he did it when one could see that his powers were not of the best. He was Grand Master and that mattered more to him and he must serve his term of office, but God willed it not. So he was taken before he laid down the gavel of order and decorum and became one more to join those familiar faces of Past Grand Masters who occupy their places in the East.

He died in harness as it were. We can say, as the Psalmist of old did, "He shall be like a tree planted by the waterside, that will bring forth his fruit in due season." He has brought forth his fruit of good works and his leaf of hope never withered.

Our brother has now left us for a while, but long will his memory be cherished in this Masonic Fraternity, which he loved so dearly and for which he gave the best that was in him. LAugust

He has left behind him a worthy example which will prove an inspiration to those who follow after.

It is good for us to have known John Thornton and to feel his influence upon us still. We shall look forward to meeting our honoured friend again; to meeting him in the serene peace and the open vision of the Celestial Lodge above.

We, as Masons, feel for those who are left to mourn his loss. Sorrow and sadness have come into the midst of the family circle.

God works in a mysterious way His wonders to perform. His way is not our way. So as Masons we ask them to trust God and the day will come when He will reveal to all hearts the meaning of sadness and sorrow.

Our earnest prayer is that God may be with them and grant them His peace and consolation.

The R:W: Deputy Grand Master delivered the following address:—

#### DEPUTY GRAND MASTER'S REPORT

#### BRETHREN OF GRAND LODGE:

For the first time in the seventy-three years' history of this Grand Lodge a Deputy Grand Master is called upon to preside over an Annual Communication through the death of the Grand Master. Only on one previous occasion, as far as I can ascertain, has the Deputy Grand Master presided throughout an Annual Session, and that was in 1887, when the Grand Master was unavoidably absent from the Province.

It was a great shock to receive word on April 26th last that John Thornton, Most Worshipful Grand Master, had been called from this world to the world beyond. Grand Lodge was immediately summoned by a notice in the Saint John newspapers to assemble for the funeral on Sunday, April 28th, at 2.30 o'clock. Similarly the six Saint John City lodges were summoned to attend by lodge notices published in the press. Sunday proved to be a beautiful day and with a large attendance the craft made its way by automobile from the Masonic Temple to St. Matthew's Presbyterian Church, Douglas Avenue, where a most impressive service was held with Rev. Dr. J. A. Morison, the Minister, conducting, and Rev. W. C. V. Martin, the Grand Chaplain, assisting. On leaving the church a procession was formed, and after proceeding for a number of city blocks on foot, the fraternity repaired by automobile to Fernhill cemetery, still accompanying the remains. There in the grave with due Masonic

ceremonial we laid the mortal remains of our late Grand Master, and, as we turned away from the performance of the last sad rites I could not but reflect that truly death is no respecter of persons. Our distinguished Brother was stricken at the height of his Masonic career. His passing emphasizes that we should all be prepared for that summons to "Divine Refreshment" which cometh from the Supreme Grand Master at an hour that we know not.

I wish to add my tribute to the character and worth of the late Grand Master and to acknowledge with grateful memory the kindly manner with which he always treated me.

During the past year the hand of death has been placed upon others of our connection, and, as we enumerate them, we extend sympathy to their families. Besides our beloved Grand Master, we mourn for:—

Who, among those dear departed ones, could their voices again be heard by us, would not plead that we maintain with greater assiduity the character of our professions? Let us be admonished by the symbols of our ceremonies and of our craft to keep our trestle boards clear of untrue and unlovely markings, and, using the clean implements with which our Great Creator has equipped us, endeavor to design and live as befits our station as Masons. Thus may we experience the satisfaction of well-spent lives, and die in the hope of a glorious immortality.

So be our passing!

Our task accomplished and the long day done,

Our wages taken and in our hearts some late lark singing;

Let us be gathered to the Silent West, the Sundown Splendid, and Serene Death.

Scarcely had we dispersed from our last Annual Meeting before the long-dreaded calamity of war burst upon an anxious world. The mailed fist tore through the stitching of the velvet glove, and the Madman of Munich, who had been preparing for conquest for years beforehand, was striding through the peaceful nations of Europe. One by one we have seen them

fall, and even France, beset by foes from without and within, has come under the iron heel of the oppressor. Great Britain, hard-pressed, aided by her Dominions and Colonies and those forces of her allies who have escaped from the enemy, fights on. In the dark hour, it is a source of pride to us to realize that today, as in the past, the members of our fraternity in this country have been obedient to the call, and have enrolled in every Canadian unit now in Britain, on the high seas, or in formation at home. Their loyalty expects no extended commendation, their patriotism no flowery words. They are ready and willing to lay down their lives for the sacred principles of liberty and democracy. We pray that God in His mercy will watch over their goings-out and their comings-in, and grant victory to their efforts. But we must ever bear in mind that those of us who are beyond the age limit, or who cannot pass a qualifying medical examination, have no right to sit idly by on the sidelines, for we have our part to play. It is our bounden duty to support the patriotic and charitable institutions in connection with the war work and to serve in whatever capacity we may be called upon by lawful authority to undertake. In common with all citizens of the Empire we must see that nothing is left undone to accomplish the successful prosecution of the war to the end that the forces of evil and aggression may be overthrown and the forces of righteousness and peace established in their stead.

I have since received a letter from Brother Aechternacht expressing thanks for the appointment and extending fraternal greetings.

I did not make any official visits to Lodges in the jurisdiction excepting that on the special invitation of Bethel Lodge No. 40, Edmundston, I was present at their annual church service in honor of St. John's Day on June 16th.

On October 17th I accompanied our late Most Worshipful Grand Master on a visit to Trinity Lodge No. 130, Presque Isle, Maine, where a special communication was held in connection with the celebration of an International Masonic Night. Masons from both sides of the border were present, some 335 in all, and a splendid banquet was served preceding the Lodge meeting. Additional New Brunswick Grand Lodge officers attending on the Grand Master were:—R. W: Alan D. King, Junior Grand Warden; V. W: Robert D. Magee, Grand Secretary, and District Deputy Grand Masters Harley L. Wright and William Jones. The Grand Master of Maine, George F. Giddings; Grand Secretary Converse E. Leach, and many other present and past Grand Lodge officers of Maine

"That when Grand Lodge take recess it take recess until 7.30 o'clock this evening and the first order of business then be the election of Grand Lodge officers." Carried.

It was moved by R:W: Brother S. M. Wetmore, seconded by W: Brother Dr. W. B. Jones:—

"That an appropriation of five hundred dollars be made to the M:W: Grand Master to defray the expenses of visiting and instructing the Private Lodges during the year." Carried.

It was moved by R:W: Brother Guy H. Humphrey, seconded by R:W: Brother A. E. Pearson:—

"That a sum not to exceed \$25.00 be allowed the District Deputy Grand Masters to defray travelling expenses on their District visits, if they find it necessary; and that expense reports be submitted to the office of the Grand Secretary with their reports to the Grand Master." Carried.

On motion of R:W: Brother Henry D. Hopkins, seconded by W: Brother B. E. Wilson, the following resolution of regret at Masonic conditions in Europe was adopted:—

"That this Grand Lodge has learned with great regret of the suppression of the Masonic Grand Lodges in France and other countries under control of the Dictators of Europe; such occurances make us value more than ever the freedom of thought and speech permitted throughout the British Commonwealth of Nations, and deepen the loyalty to King and Country of every member of the Masonic Order in this jurisdiction."

R:W: G. Percy Burchill, Past Grand Master, spoke feelingly of the continued absence, through ill-

ness, of R:W: Brother, Past Grand Master George D. Ellis and prayed for a speedy recovery and return to his usual vocations. R:W: Brother Burchill also made reference to the accident that had befallen our Senior Past Grand Master, R:W: LeBaron Wilson, which kept him from his usual seat in the Grand East. That they were missed by the brethren assembled was shown by the many expressions voiced by several present.

On motion by V:W: H. Russell Sturdee, seconded by R:W: Dr. Frank A. Godsoe, baskets of flowers were ordered sent R:W: Brothers Wilson and Ellis, and also W: Brother Fred W. Barton, Junior Grand Deacon, who was confined to the General Public Hospital and had lately undergone an operation, and that letters of regret at their inability to be present at this session of Grand Lodge accompany the bouquets.

Many letters expressing regret at the sudden passing of our M:W: Grand Master, John Thornton, were received from a number of Sister Grand Jurisdictions and individual brethren throughout the Province.

A Committee composed of R:W: Brothers S. M. Wetmore, H. A. Porter and W: Brothers Dr. W. B. Jones, E. C. Rice and J. H. Crockett prepared and presented the following resolution, which was unanimously adopted by Grand Lodge:—

"That this Grand Lodge in annual session approve the proposal of voluntary contributions for war purposes, among Masons throughout the jurisdiction, and that the Grand Secretary, on behalf of Grand Lodge, request the various lodges to make a special appeal among their respective memberships for an amount to equal \$2.00 per member, this fund to be completed within three months and to be placed in

the hands of a special committee with authority to use the same according to their discretion; and further, that the sum of \$50.00, from the General Account of Grand Lodge, for administration expenses be allotted the committee."

The Right Worshipful Deputy Grand Master:— "Grand Lodge will now take recess."

#### THURSDAY EVENING

August 22nd, 1940.

Grand Lodge resumed labour at 7.30 o'clock, the R:W: Deputy Grand Master in the East, and proceeded to the election of Grand Lodge officers.

The Credentials Committee presented a further report as to the attendance of members and received the thanks of the Deputy Grand Master.

The sections of the Constitutions of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick relating to the elections were read, and the Deputy Grand Master then appointed as Scrutineers:—R:W: Brothers R. Percy Dickson and James S. Hoyt and W: Brothers R. Reid Richards and G. H. I. Cockburn.

On written nomination and ballots cast, R:W: Charles Arthur Alexander was elected Most Worshipful Grand Master and was declared so elected amid general applause.

Also on written nomination and ballots cast in each case, the Scrutineers reported that the following Brethren had received a majority of the votes cast, in each instance, and they were severally declared duly elected:—

R:W: Brother G. Percy Burchill presented and read the report of the Committee on the Address of the Deputy Grand Master, and, on motion, duly seconded, the report was received and approved and ordered to be printed in full in the Annual Proceedings of Grand Lodge, and that the recommendations contained therein be adopted.

#### REPORT ON DEPUTY GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS

August 22nd, 1940.

TO THE GRAND LODGE OF FREE AND ACCEPTED MASONS OF NEW BRUNSWICK:

The Committee to which was referred the address of the Deputy Grand Master beg leave to report as follows:—

That it concurs with the Right Worshipful Deputy Grand Master's reference concerning the lamented passing of our faithful, tried and trusted Most Worshipful Grand, Master, John Thornton on April 25th, 1939. The many expressions of sympathy received by the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick from Sister Grand Jurisdictions and the many messages received by his family attest to his worthiness and to the grievous loss this Grand Lodge has sustained in his death. To his family we extend our sincere sympathy.

We note also the many other honored Brethren of the Craft who have been called to the Celestial

Lodge above and we mourn their passing and extend to their families and to their Mother Lodges our sincere sympathy. May they rest in peace and may Light Perpetual shine upon them. Before we leave this part of the report may we say that we are glad to know that the very excellent address given by the V:W: Grand Chaplain, the Rev. W. C. V. Martin, in memory of our late Grand Master is to be printed in the Annual Proceedings of Grand Lodge.

We note and commend the words of the Right Worshipful Deputy Grand Master in relation to our duties as Masons in the present conflict and would stress the fact that every member of every subordinate Lodge in this Grand Lodge jurisdiction should do his best to serve in whatever capacity he may be called upon by lawful authority. It is our duty as Masons and as citizens of this great Commonwealth of Nations, which is the British Empire, to do so.

Again we notice that our relations with Sister Grand Jurisdictions continues to be of the friendliest nature and that is pleasing to the Fraternity.

The visit of our late Grand Master and his officers to our neighbors to the South on October 17, 1939, at Presque Isle, Maine, we believe, strengthened the feeling of Brotherhood and Good-Will among men and nations. Many prominent members of the Order from both sides of the boundary were in attendance.

We agree with the R:W: Deputy Grand Master that the very fitting newspaper account of the funeral of Most Worshipful Brother John Thornton should be included in the Proceedings of Grand Lodge and printed in the same.

## Of District Deputy Grand Masters

#### DISTRICT No. 1

Hampton, N. B., August 13th, 1940.

Right Worshipful Deputy Grand Master:-

I beg leave to submit the following report and resume of my activities for the year ending August 22nd, 1940.

As in the year previous, I have attempted to give my time and attention to the Lodges in my jurisdiction, where instruction was most needed and attended many rehearsals in the Lodges at Sussex, Saint Martins, as well as my mother Lodge at Hampton and I am pleased to report improvement in the work of all degrees in these three Lodges.

August, 1939, I attended a rehearsal at Saint Martins, several brothers from Hampton accompanying me.

I was sorry not to have been in my place in attendance at his funeral, I was a patient in hospital at the time.

I have found the ritual closely followed throughout the District. In some instances corrections in the floor work were necessary. I was cordially welcomed and hospitably entertained in all the Lodges and have gained much in knowledge and experience through this contact with my Masonic brethren. I wish to thank the Lodges in this District for their friendship and hospitality and also the brethren who accompanied me on my visits, particularly Worshipful Brothers John E. Andrews and Errold C. Wilson and Brothers Berton Olmstead and John Hudson, the two latter now being with the Canadian Forces.

On April 4th, I visited Benjamin Lodge No. 31, Andover. Worshipful Master Newton Rogers conferred the Entered Apprentice Degree upon a candidate in a most efficient manner, ably supported by Brother Edward Palmer, Senior Warden, and the other officers.

On April 5th, I attended a regular communication of Hartland Lodge Number 46. In the absence of Worshipful Master Frank McMullin, who was confined to bed with lagrippe, I had the pleasure of witnessing the Fellow Craft Degree conferred upon two promising young men by yourself. I was particularly impressed with the work of Brothers Arthur Kearney, Senior Warden, and Lawrence McCutcheon, Senior Deacon. All officers showed a lively interest in the work.

I visited Woodstock Lodge Number 11, Woodstock, on May 2nd, at a regular communication, when Worshipful Master Ray Hall passed two fine candidates to the Fellow Craft Degree, with the able assistance of Brother Willard Cluff, Senior Warden, and the other officers of the Lodge. On May 9th, I visited Carleton Lodge Number 35 at East Florenceville. Worshipful Master Carvell Green conferred the Fellow Craft Degree upon four candidates ably assisted by Brother Raymond McCain, Senior Warden. The work of this Lodge shows the interest of all the officers and the efforts of Past Masters Charles Caldwell and Winston Sipprell. It

was an added pleasure to find you sir, present with other members of Hartland Lodge on this occasion. I regret that I was unable to attend the June communication of this Lodge and see the raising of these four candidates, to which all the Lodges in the District were invited and at which I understand there was a very large attendance.

On Sunday, June 17th, I accompanied you to Divine Service with Bethel Lodge Number 40 in the United Church at Edmundston. There was a large number present from the District and from the adjoining District in Maine. Brother the Reverend C. D. Wentworth was the speaker and Reverend W. E. Aitkin, pastor of the church, conducted the service. The offering was donated to the New Brunswick Protestant Orphans Home, which is the usual custom in this Lodge.

I did not officially visit Colebrooke Number 39, my own Lodge at Grand Falls, but have been present at all the communications during the year. While there has not been as much work as we would wish, we have raised one candidate and accepted another application. Worshipful Brother Errold C. Wilson, Worshipful Master, and Brother Bernard Andersen, Senior Warden, with their associated officers are carrying on efficiently.

On October 17th, 1939, it was my privilege to be present with yourself, our late Most Worshipful Grand Master and the Very Worshipful Grand Secretary at the International Night held at Unity Lodge in Presque Isle, Maine, where we met the Most Worshipful Grand Master and other Grand Officers of Maine as well as the Governor of that State, Brother Louis O. Barrows. Three hundred and thirty-five brethren from Maine and New Brunswick attended. This was

the second occasion on which I have attended International Night, which has now become an annual affair, put on by the Past Masters' Association of Northern Maine under the direction of Worshipful Brother Henry Rouark, of Presque Isle, and which takes the form of a banquet with speech-making and a Lodge meeting afterwards.
