ANNUAL MEETING

Saint John, N. B., August 26th, 1943.

The Annual Meeting of "The Masonic Grand Lodge Corporation" was held this morning in the Masonic Temple, in the City of Saint John, at ten o'clock, pursuant to notice given in the Proclamation summoning the Annual Communication of Grand Lodge.

The meeting was called to order at the hour appointed by the President.

It was moved by M:W: James S. Hoyt and seconded by R:W: B. E. Wilson, that the Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Corporation held August 27, 1942, be accepted as read (they having been printed in the Annual Proceedings of Grand Lodge and distributed) and that they be confirmed. Carried.

V:W: Herman E. Sullivan, Grand Treasurer, presented and read the Statement of the Corporation Accounts for the past year. (Copies had been previously distributed to the Brethren present). The Statement set forth the Receipts and Expenditures on General Account and also of the Fund of Benevolence and a list of the Assets of the Fund. The Grand Treasurer's Statement had previously been considered and adopted by the Board of Directors of the Corporation.

On motion by R:W: Bro. W. Grant Smith, seconded by R:W: Bro. B. E. Wilson, the Statements of the Grand Treasurer were received and laid on the table.

The Audit Committee submitted a detailed report as to the Accounts; after the Report had been read a motion was made by R:W: Bro. W. Grant Smith, seconded by R:W: Bro. A. E. Pearson, and adopted:

"That the Accounts of the V:W: Grand Treasurer be taken from the table; that they and the Report of the Auditors, as printed and in the hands of the brethren, be received and that they both be presented to Grand Lodge with a view of being printed in the Annual Proceedings." Carried.

THE SEVENTY-SIXTH ANNUAL COMMUNICATION of "The Grand Lodge of the Antient and Honourable Fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick" was held at the Masonic Temple, Germain Street, in the City of Saint John, on Thursday, the twenty-sixth day of August, A.D. 1943, A.L. 5943.

When Grand Lodge resumed labour the M:W: Grand Master read the following address:—

GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS

*Right Worshipful, Very Worshipful and Worshipful
Brothers of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick:*

MY DEAR BRETHREN:—

This morning I was privileged to welcome you to this, the Seventy-sixth, Annual Communication of our Grand Lodge. To those of you who have registered since then, I extend a hearty welcome. I very much appreciate the attendance of so large a number of the Brethren.

We offer our sincere thanks to the Supreme Architect of the Universe for His guidance and preservation during the Masonic year just ending and for the privilege of being again able to meet together as Free men and Free Masons in a Free country. The four years of war through which we have passed have left their mark in many ways and although, at the present time, we feel the Allies have definitely the supremacy in the air, on land and in and under the sea yet we are well aware of the suffering and sacrifices yet to be made by our dear ones in exchange for the freedom and peace we so ardently crave. All this sacrifice and suffering must mean a greater and heavier burden on the Christian and free-thinking peoples who will have the responsibility of reconstructing this old world into a new and better one, where Peace and Harmony and Love must be the Keystone of a magnificent structure and be surrounded by a solid foundation of Perfect Ashlars, creating for all Time an everlasting Security and Freedom.

We pray that the Supreme Grand Master will guide and direct those in authority and in high offices; give them grace and power to foresee and plan for progress and the frustration of our enemies; that unity between all peoples be again restored with as little destruction and disaster as possible; that those who plan and arrange our post-war world may be guided by His Almighty Wisdom; that the Light of Freemasonry may be spread with unfailing brightness throughout the world and that each of us may be spared to do our part in this final reconstruction. Let us be truly United, my Brethren, and cement the fraternal teachings and doctrines of our glorious Institution in our every-day lives as well as when we are met together as Masons. May we thus demonstrate to all the world that Masonic teachings, like Christianity, with Right and Justice, shall forever prevail.

This Grand Jurisdiction has contributed generously and splendidly to the brave and gallant Armed Forces of our country. I regret that I cannot report, at the moment, the number of our Brethren who are in our country's service both at home and abroad. I do hope, however, that the Masters and Secretaries of the various Lodges who have not yet done so will be prompt in answering the questionnaire now in their hands on this subject in order that we may complete the statistics in this regard. We owe a great deal to these Brethren for their valiant deeds and sacrifices and we join with our Brethren of the various Lodges in deep and sincere sympathy for those who have already paid the supreme sacrifice. Their brave deeds will be long cherished and our heartfelt sympathy is extended to their bereaved.

During the year, I was privileged to officially visit the following Lodges in this Jurisdiction:—

Likewise, on November 7, 1942, I installed Wor-

shipful Brother George William Smith of Sunbury Lodge No. 42 as Grand Standard Bearer of this Grand Lodge.

On my visit to Ashlar Lodge No. 36, on November 19, I installed Worshipful Brother William John Gaynor of this Lodge as District Deputy Grand Master of District No. 5.

On May 5, 1943, I installed Worshipful Brother George Burpee Burnett, of Sussex Lodge No. 4 as Grand Sword Bearer of this Grand Jurisdiction.

I accepted the invitations of Albion Lodge, Saint John's Lodge, The Corinthian Lodge, Hibernia Lodge, The New Brunswick Lodge and The Union Lodge of Portland, to install their Worshipful Masters at their annual meetings, at which time I made my official visitation to each of these Lodges. The ceremony of installation was carried out according to the ritual of the Grand Lodge and it afforded me a great deal of pleasure to install the various Officers.

I received an invitation from the Grand Lodge of Quebec to attend their annual assembly in the City of Montreal on October 14, last. This invitation I gladly accepted in order to renew fraternal relations with bordering Jurisdictions. I was introduced to their Grand Lodge by my good friend and Worshipful Brother J. Harry Spence, Past Grand Director of Ceremonies of this Grand Lodge, and received a most hearty welcome by the Most Worshipful Grand Master A. W. Mitchell. Among the many notable Masonic visitors were:—Most Worshipful John A. McRae, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Canada in Ontario; Most Worshipful Douglas Fraser, Grand Master of Saskatchewan; Most Worshipful Kady L. Earle, Grand Master of Vermont; Right Worshipful Win-

throp J. Cushing, Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts, and many other Past Grand Masters and Grand Officers from various Jurisdictions. I received a great deal of Masonic benefit from this visitation, and the interchange of fraternal visitations will be of great benefit to this Grand Lodge.

On the invitation of Most Worshipful John A. McRae, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Canada in Ontario, I accompanied him on his official visit to Kilwinning Lodge No. 565 in the City of Toronto, it being their annual Grand Lodge night, November 16, 1942. We were escorted into the lodge room by five pipers, and heartily welcomed by Worshipful Brother H. W. Wallace, the Worshipful Master. He and all his officers were in full Scottish dress. It was a most enjoyable and memorable evening. I regret very much that the now Immediate Past Grand Master John A. McRae cannot be with us at this Assembly in New Brunswick as we had very definite plans of attending each other's Annual Assembly. Unfortunately, I had to cancel my plans of attending the Grand Lodge of Canada in Ontario in July, owing to the sudden and serious illness of my mother.

I accepted the kind invitation of the Potentate of Luxor Temple A. A. O. N. M. S. to attend their annual fall get-together, when the Imperial Potentate of the Order paid his official visit to this Temple in Saint John. I was most cordially received as the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick and enjoyed a very lovely evening, along with the representatives of the other Masonic Bodies in this Jurisdiction.

I regret very much that I had to extend my regrets to the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts as I was

unable to attend their meeting of April 15th of this year, as I had already made plans to visit officially one of the Lodges in this Jurisdiction, prior to my receiving the invitation from this Grand Lodge.

I also regret that I was unable to accept the invitation to attend the annual meeting of the Grand Lodge of Maine on May 15th of this year, as previous arrangements for official visitations in this Jurisdiction interfered with this date also. I am sure visitations with both of these Grand Lodges would have been of great benefit and much good would have been the outcome.

At my direction the Right Worshipful Deputy Grand Master Boyce A. Atkinson installed the Officers of Keith Lodge No. 23, and Sussex Lodge No. 4 at their annual meetings, and I very much appreciate the assistance of the Deputy Grand Master and the fine work that he is doing for Masonry in this Jurisdiction.

During the last war, and particularly in the years immediately following, Freemasonry experienced a very rapid growth and naturally the Lodges showed a large increase in membership.

This period was followed, however, by a gradual loss of membership for many reasons. It would therefore seem that we should start planning immediately for our post-war Masonry in order that we secure the best material available, as the future of each of our Lodges is dependent on the selection from its members, for its Officers and Masters, and when selection into our Lodges has been made, our plans and regulations should be such that a Mason will be kept constantly eager to be in attendance at Lodge meetings, with something bigger and stronger than the conferring of degree work only. I have many

times been surprised, when deep-thinking and well-respected Brethren of our Lodges do not regularly attend the meetings but offer as vague reasons for not doing so that the repetition of degree work gets wearisome for them.

I have noticed, in some Lodges, in other Jurisdictions, that they restrict the degree work to a certain number of meetings during the season and thus open the way for a greater variety of programs particularly during the winter months, and I believe we are all interested in instructional and educational meetings, with possibly some musical evenings and good speakers. We want to make the meetings of our Lodges so that the Brethren will want to come to their Lodge meetings just as keenly as going to a place of amusement.

Therefore, Brethren, it is well for us to consider plans for our future by interchanging and expressing ideas which, when adopted, will place Masonry on a still higher standing than it has ever been in the past and that it will let the power of the Fraternity be strongly felt in all of our communities.

Thus I quote—

"Take heed, Master Craftsmen, when this Temple shall arise,
With its brave and gleaming Towers pointing grandly to the
skies,
Let yourselves compose the structure, let yourselves the Tem-
ple be
That shall stand in great proportions unto all Eternity."

The climax of interesting meetings during this year, I believe, was when I received the invitation from the Rector of Trinity Church, Saint John, to attend Divine Service there. The invitation was gladly accepted and on June 27th, the Sunday nearest Saint

John the Baptist Day, Grand Lodge, accompanied by many of the nearby Lodges, in full regalia, assembled in the Masonic Temple and marched into Trinity Church for the eleven o'clock service.

The Very Worshipful Grand Chaplain, Rev. Joseph McAlden, delivered a splendid Masonic sermon, and several Past Grand Chaplains assisted Right Worshipful Brother Canon Lawrence with the service.

The morning did not appear to be very promising but around ten o'clock the sun broke through the clouds and we had a lovely day. It was most inspiring to see the large number of Brethren who turned out on this occasion and I am grateful for this fine showing and I must particularly mention the fact that the Worshipful Master and Officers of Sussex Lodge No. 4 were enthusiastic enough to travel that long distance to join in our service.

For several years I have had suggestions offered to me in connection with District meetings to be presided over by the District Deputy Grand Masters, and I have reviewed the Annual Reports of several Grand Lodges who are carrying out this procedure. The District Deputy Grand Master arranges with the Lodges in his District to have a meeting at some central point at which time business for the District is considered and also ritualistic work clarified. At these meetings the Grand Master and Grand Secretary are present to offer their guidance and assistance where necessary. These District meetings are the means by which the Grand Officers can become acquainted with the conditions of the Order throughout the Jurisdiction over which they preside and I believe it would be a means of covering a greater amount of territory during the term of a Grand Master and would allow

him to make recommendations and changes to Grand Lodge, on the expiration of his year of office, whereas it is practically impossible for a Grand Master to cover a Jurisdiction as large as New Brunswick all in one year. As my report shows, it was impossible for me this year to make any visitations in the northern portion of our Jurisdiction, as I endeavored to cover the southern portion as completely as possible, particularly making my first visitations to Lodges not previously visited in the year preceding. I think it would be well for Grand Lodge to discuss this question.

Last year, when you did me the honor of electing me as your Grand Master, all I was able to say to you for your kindness was "thank you." Now I must tell you that my term of office has been a most enjoyable one to me, the associations and visitations with the Brethren, the renewing of old acquaintances and the making of new, will, I believe, help to bind our Jurisdiction more closely together. I sincerely trust that the few things which I have attempted to do have met with your approval and that I wish for my successor in this office, all the joy and pleasure which the Grand Master's rank can afford.

With every good wish for the future of this Grand Lodge, I respectfully submit this report.

It is still regrettable to note that a few of the Lodge Secretaries are still dilatory about sending in their Annual Returns and the several forms required under our Constitutions. Worshipful Masters are responsible that these Returns and Forms be sent promptly and I feel that they should make a little larger survey of what is happening within their Lodges and see to it that their Secretary does not lapse and that their Treasurer and Audit Committee conform to our Laws and Regulations.

Two Lodges revised their By-Laws and submitted them to the M:W: Grand Master for his approval which was given in each case after a few minor errors had been corrected.

In Dispensations issued will be noted a decline in those for Divine Service over other years. This is due in part, no doubt, to the fact that our Grand Master held Divine Service in Saint John on the Sunday nearest to Saint John the Baptist Day, the date usually chosen by our Lodges for such an event. In respect to Dispensations for Divine Service I would

suggest that no premium be placed thereon and that Lodges be granted such Dispensations gratis.

I have to report that very few of the Subordinate Lodges appear to be presenting copies of the Constitutions and General Regulations of our Grand Lodge to their newly admitted members. This appears from the small number being sold and it is not possible that many of the Lodges carry extensive stocks of this necessary article over the period I have occupied this office. By-Laws and Constitutions are a "MUST" to our new Brethren and I hope those not presenting such will correct this lapse in our Law and conform immediately. A goodly supply is on hand and will be promptly mailed upon order. A supply of By-Laws should also be kept for distribution.

*To the M:W: The Grand Master,
Officers and Members of Grand Lodge:*

At the Annual Communication of Grand Lodge in 1941 the M:W: Grand Master was pleased to appoint a Committee on Fraternal Correspondence—a duty formerly carried out by our late Past Grand Master James Vroom. Since his demise this phase of our Masonic labours has been somewhat neglected—insofar as a regular report to Grand Lodge is concerned.

It has been my pleasure for many years to read the reports of the various Grand Lodges coming to hand and I, personally, have derived much benefit and Masonic education from these official publications and I know that my co-reviewers, Past Grand Master Gordon and our Grand Secretary, have likewise enjoyed this work and have been equally instructed.

A large number of Proceedings of Sister Grand Lodges have been reviewed by your committee during the year and much valuable and instructive material has been earmarked for documentation at a later date so that we might have a record readily available. Such work will entail considerable labour and we would suggest that the matter be referred to the Board of General Purposes with a view of having the work done apart from the regular duties of any particular officer of Grand Lodge.

One particular factor appearing in a great many of these valuable publications is the practice of distributing fifty-year buttons or certificates to those worthy members of the Craft who have attained that ripe Masonic age and we would strongly urge upon

this Grand Lodge that this phase of Masonic recognition be seriously considered at this time and that we likewise devise some suitable emblem or button for like Masonic service and membership. The cost would not be large and the effect upon the Craft in our jurisdiction could not help but be valuable.

Another item of large interest is the issuance of Cipher Rituals. A large number of our Sister Grand Bodies issue such and control them closely. They are not issued for general sale among the Craft. Your committee feels that such an issue by this Grand Lodge would be of most valuable assistance to our subordinate lodges, which are more or less far removed from the Ritual Committee of Grand Lodge and are therefore unable to procure the help and assistance necessary to give them a thorough understanding and knowledge of our Ritual. We strongly suggest that this matter be referred to the Board of General Purposes with power to act thereon.

The committee is quite aware that it is financially impossible to publish a regular review of other Grand Lodge Proceedings at present but we would suggest that an effort be made in the future to make report in our printed pages of many of the valuable and enlightening writings found in these publications. We are sure that the Craft would be educated and instructed.

The Special Committee appointed to consider constitutional amendments insofar as Petitions from members of the Armed Forces would be concerned made report as follows:—

*To the M:W: The Grand Master,
Officers and Members of Grand Lodge:*

Your committee to whom was referred the question of considering an amendment of the Constitutions of this Grand Lodge insofar as Petitions from members of the Armed Forces would be concerned beg to report as follows:—

We have given this subject close and serious thought and have arrived at the conclusion that Section 4 "Of Proposing Members" as printed in our Constitutions covers this subject in all respects but subject to the time factor as is embodied in Section 2 on the same subject; as also Sections 5-6-7-8-9 and 10. Your committee feels that that portion of Section 2 deleted by order and direction of this Grand Lodge at its Annual Communication held August 28th, 1941, be again added thereto and make the Section read, in part, "unless he has been domiciled or has resided," etc.

As it would be impossible for any member of the Armed Forces to be a resident within the Constitutions as now published and amended, your committee feels that the only amendment necessary to make this Section agreeable would have to contain the words, "has been domiciled." It is obvious that no member of H. M. Armed Forces can be said to "reside" in any one locality to conform to our present law.

"That the Constitutions of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick relating to the Fund of Benevolence as found in Section 3 'Of the Fund of Benevolence' be amended by adding to this Section the following: 'with the sole exception that grand lodge may order and direct that an amount not to exceed twenty-five per centum of the unexpended balance of income of the fund in any year be transferred to the credit of the grand lodge account of general purposes'."

On the motion being put it was declared carried.

It was moved by R:W: B. E. Wilson, seconded by R:W: W. Grant Smith:

"That an amount not to exceed twenty-five per centum of the unexpended balance of income of the Fund of Benevolence be transferred to the credit of the grand lodge account of general purposes." Carried.

Grand Lodge now took recess and, at the request of the M:W: Grand Master and the Ritual Committee of Grand Lodge, Hibernia Lodge No. 3 of Saint John under their Worshipful Master, W: Murray Latham, conferred the Master Mason Degree in a very able manner and was congratulated by the Grand Master on behalf of Grand Lodge.

We regret the passing of so many of the active members of the Craft and trust that the younger

members will assume the burden carried by their predecessors.

Your committee wish to congratulate the Grand Master on the number of Lodges visited during the year.
