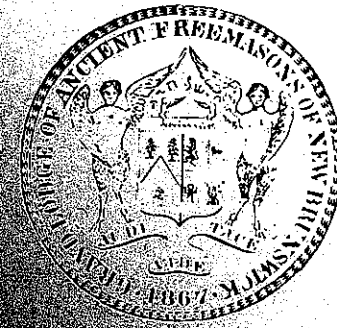

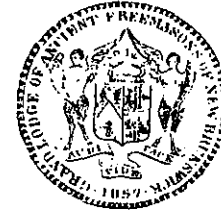

Price and the Grand and Assistant Grand Directors of Ceremonies, the brethren of Grand Lodge paraded to Trinity Anglican Church for the Annual Service of Worship and Thanksgiving conducted by V:W: Bro Rev. Gerald Gray assisted by Rev. Christopher Pratt, Rector and W: Bro Michael Saunders, Grand Organist.

DEVOTIONAL ADDRESS MASONIC SERVICE

The Text I have chosen for to-day's service is "THE COMMAND THAT CHRIST HAS GIVEN US IS THIS: WHOSOEVER LOVES GOD MUST LOVE HIS BROTHER ALSO" taken from the 4th Chapter First Epistle of John, verse 21.

The members of the Masonic Fraternity are all brethren. This Fraternal organization is based on the building of King Solomon's temple as we heard read in our first Lesson for the day. The building in which we meet is called a "Temple", emblematic of the temple built by King Solomon and the people of Israel. We shall look briefly at the word of God as revealed to Solomon—"IF YOU WILL WALK IN MY STATUTES AND OBEY MY ORDINANCES AND KEEP ALL MY COMMANDMENTS AND WALK IN THEM THEN I WILL ESTABLISH MY WORD WITH YOU." 1st. Kings, Chapter 6, verse 12. This is a promise of God to Solomon. The temple was built of stone to a great extent and we learn that the stones were made ready for the building of the temple before they were brought to the site. The stone masons of that day prepared every stone to fit in its appointed place when it arrived and the scripture goes on to say that there was not heard the sound of an axe, saw or hammer in the building of the temple. It took eleven years to build it from beginning to end. The foundation was laid in the 4th year so the actual building of the temple took seven years.

We can use the building of King Solomon's temple as an emblem of our own lives. Each one of us may be likened to a stone or a timber in the building, **not** of King Solomon's temple, but in the building of God's Kingdom. **OUR BODIES ARE TEMPLES OF GOD.** We have a very nice hymn in our Anglican Hymn Book which reads:

"Temple of God's Holy Spirit,
Not my own, this human frame.

Not for self and flesh to mar it,
Spotless keep his fair abode.

There is a lot of good meaning in this hymn if we heed it. **Spotless** means to keep ourselves free of sin and walk in His Holy ways on this earth so that at the last when we reach eternity — it will be said of us "WELL DONE THOU GOOD AND FAITHFUL SERVANT" for it is on this earth that we prepare for God's Kingdom.

If someone asked me - "How do I know that God exists"?, I would answer - "Just look at ourselves for our bodies show us there is a God. For instance, think of our heads. Engineers have finally succeeded in making computers. Thousands of years ago, God designed a wonderful computer and made it small enough to be carried around in our heads. It is our **brain**. This brain can figure out all kinds of things. It can recall the past and it can plan the future. Our brain suggests there is a God. Our eyes, heart, limbs and all the other members of our body all point to a wonderful Designer behind us. You are "FEARFULLY AND WONDERFULLY MADE." Psalm 139, verse 4.

The most wonderful thing about our temples (bodies) is not just its testimony to the existence of God. It is its ability to receive Him, to allow Him to dwell within it. I do not mean that it has an empty space of so many cubic inches which God can inhabit. He wants to be invited inside it. He says, "BEHOLD I STAND AT THE DOOR AND KNOCK; IF ANY MAN HEAR MY VOICE AND OPEN THE DOOR I WILL COME IN TO HIM." Revelation 3rd chapter, verse 20. My brothers and Christian friends the Lord loves us and desires our happiness. Trust Him and obey Him. If we learn to love God above all and our neighbor as ourselves, we will find life rich and meaningful. The last commandment Christ gave to His followers was - "LOVE ONE ANOTHER AS I HAVE LOVED YOU."

What does **LOVE** look like? It has the **hands** to help others;

It has the **feet** to hasten us to the poor and the needy;

It has the **eyes** to see misery and want;

It has the **ears** to hear the sighs and sorrows of God's children.

TODAY

Give me
Ears that hear my brother's cry
Eyes that see his need
Feet that bear me to his side
Hands that heal and feed
And over and above
Filled to overflowing
A **HEART** that gives him **LOVE**.

There is a story of a little girl who had two brothers. Someone asked her whether her mother loved **HER** best or if she loved her brothers best. The little girl replied promptly— "She loves Jimmy best because he is the oldest." "She loves Johnny best because he is the youngest and she loves me best because I am the only girl." She clearly understood that her loving parent loved each one "best of all." So it is with Jesus—He loves each and everyone of His children."

One brick doesn't seem good for much does it? But when you see a brick missing from a fireplace it may spoil the looks of that fireplace. One piece out of a jigsaw puzzle that has 500 pieces doesn't seem really important. But its absence spoils the looks of the whole picture. One page torn from a storybook surely spoils the reading pleasure. One brick, one piece of jigsaw puzzle, one page torn from a storybook — these can be highly important. **SO IS ONE PERSON.**

We all know the Shepherd story— 100 sheep to begin with and one was lost—how the Shepherd just had to find it and when he did there was much rejoicing. If one sheep is so important to a shepherd just think how important you and I must be to God! That is what Jesus is saying in the lost sheep story. God loves each one of us; every person in the world counts with Him. Everyone of us is within reach of God's love. We are so important to Him that when we are lost He will search and search for us until He finds us.

The last commandment Christ gave to His followers was: "LOVE ONE ANOTHER AS I HAVE LOVED YOU". Brethren in Christ have all one common Father, one common likeness, one object of faith, love and adoration; one blessed hope, alike in trials; alike in prayer. They lean upon the same hand, appear daily before the same mercy seat, feed at the same table. How much all these things link them together, not in profession only but in heart.

One of the greatest truths in this world, perhaps it is the greatest truth of all about Life, is that we are not ALONE. A great Someone cares for us. He loves us and is interested in the smallest detail of our lives. He believes in us and wants to help us. **The person who knows God intimately and who surrenders his life with all its problems to the Lord's guidance and direction is sustained and strengthened to meet anything and everything.**

The ultimate end of the Church is the Kingdom of God. The Church should with confidence proclaim the kingship of the Lord in this world. His kingdom must come; his will must prevail for He assures us: **IN THE WORLD YE SHALL HAVE TRIBULATION; BUT BE OF GOOD CHEER; I HAVE OVERCOME THE WORLD.** Having loved His own which are in the world, He loves them unto the end. We may rest satisfied that nothing can separate us from the love of God, which is in Jesus Christ our Lord. If we are faithless, He remaineth faithful. If we, like Peter, deny Him, yet He still looks on us with yearning affection. **OH, WHAT A FRIEND!**

In conclusion, I would urge us all to exercise our faith, show loving kindness to all men while there is still time — tomorrow may be too late! Sometimes we are so anxious in looking for tomorrow that we forget today. Sometimes we live for what **could be** rather than **what is**. Help us dear Lord to evaluate our lives in the present and live it to the fullest in Your will, and to keep that command that whosoever loves God must love his brother also.

Following the Service the brethren returned in procession and resumed labor.

The Grand Master thanked the V:W: Grand Chaplain for the inspiring service and message.

It was moved by R:W: G. D. Gruchy, seconded and carried that the Devotional address given by the Grand Chaplain be printed in full in the Proceedings.

The Grand Master reminded all present that the annual meeting of the Grand Lodge Corporation would be held at 8:30 a.m. May 10 and that all members of Grand Lodge should be in attendance. He also called attention to the location of the ballot box which would be available to receive ballots from 9:00 a.m. May 10th until the time set for closing.

It was moved by M:W: Bro Steeves that Grand Lodge take recess until 9:00 A.M. May 10 1986 and that the first order of business be the reading of nominations for the elected Grand Lodge Officers. Carried.

MORNING SESSION, SATURDAY MAY 10, 1986

The Grand Lodge resumed labour at 9:00 a.m. with the Most Worshipful The Grand Master presiding. He announced that nominations for elective offices were duly closed.

The Grand Secretary R:W: B. A. Prescott presented the nominations for the elective offices for the ensuing year and read those sections of the constitutions relating to the election of officers.

It was moved by M:W: Bro Oulton and seconded that the ballot close at 2:00 p.m. and that the election of officers be at approximately 2:30 p.m. following the report of the Credentials Committee.

The Grand Representatives present were asked to respond as their names were called and to remain standing until welcomed by the Grand Master who also requested them to extend to their respective Grand Lodges the fraternal greetings of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick.

M:W: I. Dale Steeves in responding for the representatives thanked the M:W: The Grand Master for their recognition, expressed their pleasure at serving this Grand Lodge and stated that they would be pleased to convey the fraternal greetings of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick to their respective Jurisdictions.

To our distinguished visitors who have travelled to be with us at this 119th Annual Communication of the New Brunswick Grand Lodge, we extend a most hearty welcome and trust your stay in the picture province of New Brunswick will be memorable and enjoyable.

I am most grateful to M:W: Lou Copeland, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Canada in the Province of Ontario, for so kindly accepting the invitation to be our guest speaker, at today's noon Banquet.

We ask, that each of you take back to your Grand Lodge, the fraternal best wishes from the New Brunswick Grand Lodge and hope you'll return to visit again one day soon.

NECROLOGY

Again this year, the Scythe of time has cut the brittle thread of life and taken its toll among the ranks of Grand Lodge members. In this report to Grand Lodge I would like to mention three in particular. M:W: Bro Earle Ross, R:W: Bro Ted Clouston and R:W: Bro Don Wright, all of whom passed to the Celestial Lodge above in 1986. M:W: Bro Earle Ross served as Grand Master 1975-76, R:W: Bro Ted Clouston District Deputy Grand Master District # 3, 1976-1977 and R:W: Bro Don Wright District Deputy Grand Master District # 7, 1977-1978. Their contribution to Freemasonry in this

jurisdiction merits our lasting respect and affection. They will be missed by all Grand Lodge members.

I would ask that the names of these Brethren, together with those other Brothers who have departed this life..whose memory we cherish and whose loss we all deplore, be recorded in the proceedings.

Let us now, out of respect, **rise and observe a moment of silence**, as we remember our departed Brethren. Following this the Grand Chaplain will offer an invocation in their behalf.

ALL CANADA GRAND MASTERS CONFERENCE

Again in 1986, your New Brunswick Grand Lodge participated in the All Canada Conference in Winnipeg, held March 21st and 22nd. Grand Masters, Deputy Grand Masters and Grand Lodge Secretaries attend these National meetings, with an agenda designed to encourage communication and dialogue in an informal atmosphere. Again this year the papers presented were most challenging and covered a variety of subject matter. Along with your Grand Master, was Deputy Grand Master Don Gruchy and Grand Secretary Basil Prescott.

This conference has developed into one of the most important exchange forums for Masonry in Canada. Your Grand Lodge has ordered copies of the papers for the DDGM's, so Masters interested in taking advantage of these papers should contact your District Deputy.

Your Grand Lodge has been accorded an additional honor for next year's conference, when your Grand Master will serve as President of the Conference, an honor that has come to this Grand Lodge only twice before, since the Conference was first organized 23 years ago.

1987 will also be another banner year for Masonry when the North American Grand Masters Conference will be held in Calgary. New Brunswick has been selected as one of eight Grand Lodges from across North America to act on the Conference Committee. DISTRICT DEPUTY GRAND MASTERS

I would be remiss, if I did not include in my report to this Grand Lodge, special words of praise to the Seven District Deputy Grand Masters. Their dedication and service to the Craft earns them a special place indeed. All have given many hours of their time and travelled extensively, looking after, working with and advising, the Masters, officers and members of the Blue Lodges in their District. This link between Grand Lodge and the Craft Lodge is so very important and I commend each of these R:W: Brothers for a job well done.

MOSTLY MASONRY

1985 - 1986 saw the continued publication of the Tri-yearly bulletin Mostly Masonry, with special thanks going to the DDGM's for the District distribution. It is most encouraging to see that interest is growing in this Grand Lodge publication, and V:W: Bro Alex Pincombe is to be congratulated for his editorial efforts. I have recommended to the Board of General Purposes, a Mostly Masonry standing committee be established, so that Grand Lodge can be kept informed on this important Masonic information tool. V:W: Bro Pincombe has agreed to continue as Editor in 1986-1987 and I will announce the committee structure at the next meeting of the Board of General Purposes. Your input is most important and I would ask each Worshipful Master to consider the appointment of

a member, to be responsible for providing news information on lodge activities to Mostly Masonry's Editor V:W: Bro Pincombe.

MASONIC HOUSING PROJECT

Permit me to include a few words in this report on a project that has received some discussion at my official visitations. Last June's meeting of the Board of General Purposes brought forth the suggestion that Grand Lodge explore the possibility of establishing a Masonic Housing Complex in our jurisdiction. After that meeting I appointed a committee of Masonic brethren under the chairmanship of R:W: Bro Donald Gruchy, and requested they start work on this preliminary study, with the object of presenting an interim report in November to the Board, with a final report to be presented on March 1st/86 to the Board of General Purposes.

I commend the committee for their efforts and for the volume of information, pertinent to the project, that they were able to amass as a result of this study. It was most impressive!

This report, when presented to the Board evoked a great deal of discussion, and it was a decision of that meeting, to table the report until the next meeting of the Board, after Grand Lodge.

Back in 1935, another Grand Master, the late Most Worshipful Bro Percy Burchill requested study on a similar project. It failed to achieve general acceptance, and the committee was discontinued in 1938. The 30's found the world in the midst of a Depression, difficult time to develop projects of this size. But is this true in the 80's?

STATE OF THE ORDER

We are pleased to report that many of the Lodges in our Grand Jurisdiction have degree work on the trestleboard, and this will show as growth in the new members column. The physical condition of most of the lodges I have visited, reflects a caring attitude by the members. Some lodges have taken a realistic look at cutting heating costs, through such remedial methods as applying new siding, insulation or de-doing the interior walls of the lodge. These improvements are evident in both urban and rural lodges and I feel shows a growing interest by the membership to make things better. I have a feeling that this enthusiasm may have something to do with the increase in initiations.

But membership is still an area of real concern, and in spite of all efforts, our numbers are dropping slightly. Although we do not subscribe to solicitation, we do encourage lodges to arrange Fellowship nights in the banquet room, where non masons and their wives and members and their wives can get together in an informal manner for harmony and fellowship. Some lodges in this jurisdiction have organized this kind of get together. You don't talk membership, you just practice Masonry! R:W: Bro Maurice Linkletter and his Education Committee can be of assistance in planning such an evening. He has an excellent video tape, that can be used for just such a fellowship event.

I wish to thank the Officers of Grand Lodge and members for their great kindness shown at all times. On all the official visitations, they have been most faithful in their attendance.

To the Grand Lodge Secretary, R:W: Bro Basil Prescott, I extend a special word of praise. He has been untiring in his efforts, keeping the day to day operations of your Grand Lodge office running smoothly.

We convey also in this report, a special "thank-you" to Mrs. Verda Demmings for her valued contribution. This is a special lady, and Grand Lodge would like to say: "We appreciate you". I would ask our Grand Lodge Secretary to pass along our appreciation.

POST SCRIPT

Now if you will permit, I would add this Postscript to this address. Some things I would like you, as Grand Lodge, to consider. I would like to see the New Brunswick Grand Lodge consider the establishing of a **Masonic Foundation**. The purpose of such a Foundation, to receive contributions from Brethren and others, to be used for other than benevolent purposes. Application could be made to the Federal government for a tax number, so that tax deductible receipts can be issued to contributors. A Foundation would be able to accept bequests, contributions made through wills, etc. I would like to see this matter considered and a report brought forward for next year's Grand Lodge Communication.

Another subject I'd like to suggest for consideration and study is a **Mentor's Instruction Program**, designed to give new Masons a better grounding in our great fraternity, to more fully explain our degrees and history. We have a well established Masonic

Education Committee under the chairmanship of R:W: Bro Maurice Linkletter and this Mentor program would broaden the base of instruction. I feel the end result would be, better informed Masons, who will better understand and appreciate the Fraternity to which they belong.

One other item I'd like to see some thought given too, is acquiring a computer for use in the Grand Lodge office. Perhaps a first step might be to check on a word processor. Computers, once programmed can store vast amounts of information, and make it available quickly. Alberta Grand Lodge is now computerized and others are in the process of study. It won't cost much to look into the possibilities of such equipment.

Now let me conclude with these thoughts. Less than 14 years from now we enter a new Century. What we do now, and how we do it may well determine our status as a Grand Lodge in 2000. I ask, each of you to look toward tomorrow and the year ahead with a positive attitude for Masonic progress in this jurisdiction. If each of us returns to our Lodge, determined to make things better, things will happen. The enthusiasm you generate among your lodge members is bound to have its effect on all our fraternity. But it must start with you. For if we do nothing, we dig the rut of complacency deeper and we soon will disappear.

Don't confine your meetings to just business and degrees. Develop programs that will reach out and involve your members.

Make your meetings so interesting, that members and visitors, will be anxious to attend.

The future starts tomorrow, and so quickly it becomes the past. Let us always practice what we teach, Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth and if we do this . . . our Image, our stature, or future will be enhanced.

Let's get serious about Freemasonry . . . let's get back to the basics and above all **BE PROUD TO BE A MASON!**

Thank-you.

Moved by W: Bro J. R. Andrews and seconded that the address by The Most Worshipful The Grand Master be received, printed in full in the Proceedings and referred to a Committee of Past Grand Masters for review and report. Motion carried.

The Deputy Grand Master, Rt. Wor. Bro Gruchy, then appointed a Committee of all Past Grand Masters present under the Chairmanship of Past Grand Master M. W. Dalton to review the Grand Master's address and present their report to Grand Lodge.

- f) The Comely Program - Tabled until Grand Master returns from All Canada Conference in Winnipeg.
- g) Update of files through D.D.G.M.'s on number of Masonic Widows in jurisdiction.
- h) Wearing of Fez in Lodge by Past Masters Unit - same policy.
- i) Masonic music recorded on 40 tapes at a cost of \$3.00 each.

REPORT OF THE MASONIC EDUCATION COMMITTEE

TO THE MOST WORSHIPFUL, THE GRAND MASTER

Your Grand Lodge Committee of Masonic Education submit the following report summarizing the activities of the past 12 months.

We have visited lodges in all districts at the request of the Grand Master or the Masters of the lodges and have presented talks of varying durations on 24 occasions.

On April 12th at the Temple in Salisbury, a workshop was held at the request of R:W: Bro. Owen Walton, D.D.G.M. District 2 and R:W: Bro. Robert Kidney, D.D.G.M. District 7. The workshop was well attended and a variety of Masonic items were presented and discussed.

Mostly Masonry has been printed and distributed three times this past year under the guiding hand of V:W: Bro. Alex Pincombe. Its success can be measured by the large amount of material input to the editor and comments of the craft. It is hoped that your continued support for this newsletter will foster closer ties between all the lodges in this jurisdiction.

A booklet entitled "More Light on Freemasonry" has been edited and republished. A copy of this booklet will be sent to each lodge with every constitution ordered from the Grand Secretary and is to be given to each Master Mason when he has completed the third degree. Additional copies may be obtained on request from the Grand Secretary at no cost.

Each District Deputy Grand Master has been given a VHS and a beta format video tape. These tapes have items which may be of interest to the lodges on educational or information nights. Each article is approximately 20 minutes in length and they will be added to as new information becomes available.

We have distributed to the lodges various articles which we hope will be used by the Masters as educational and reference material. This material should be kept in a binder or file for use when required. We recommend that this practise of sending material to the lodges continue in the future as we have found that many lodges are lacking in material to use for educational purposes.

We have purchased 40 audio cassettes and will have Masonic music recorded on them. This will enable lodges, which are not fortunate enough to have a piano/organ or a brother with the talent to play them, to have music available when they need it such as at installations or during the third degree.

This committee believes that the aims of Grand Lodge can best be served by providing the lodges with material in small packages and then the lodges will become responsible for the masonic education of their members. This will enable your committee to become a resource base for all lodges and not just someone to turn to when masonic education is required. Remember,

"Only through education may we strive for perfection".

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE (INCLUDING QUINN TRUST)

TO THE MOST WORSHIPFUL THE GRAND MASTER,
 OFFICERS AND MEMBERS,
 GRAND LODGE OF NEW BRUNSWICK, F. & A.M.

At the last meeting of the Board of General Purposes your Finance Committee presented the following recommendations to the Board, and these were accepted in their entirety:

1. Since the Library Funding at present seems to be adequate, it is our recommendation that no change be made in the system as followed at the present time. (You will recall that at the 1984 Session of Grand Lodge it was recommended and accepted that a maximum of \$1500.00 in interest from Quinn Trust Funds be allocated annually to Library Funding, and that up to a maximum of \$200.00 be permitted to each Lodge applying, until the \$1500.00 is exhausted. Lodges benefiting would not have preference over other Lodges applying for the first time. It was also recommended that a suitable gummed label be placed in each publication so obtained, noting that the publications were provided by the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick in grateful memory of our late Brother William G. Quinn.).

2. Your Finance Committee also recommends that the Scholarships, totaling \$10,000.00 be taken from the interest derived from the Quinn Trust Funds, as was the case last year.

3. All members of Grand Lodge will doubtless be happy to learn that we recommended NO INCREASE in the per-capita tax on the lodges in the Jurisdiction, at this time.

4. It is the recommendation of your Committee that the sum of \$550.00, which is the same amount as last year, be granted each Lodge in the Jurisdiction, from the income of the Quinn Trust Funds. We feel that this payment is a great help to the Lodges, particularly the smaller Lodges. None of the Principal of the Quinn Trust Funds has ever been touched, as was decided by all the members of Grand Lodge in attendance several years ago.

5. We would also strongly recommend that the Finance Committee be empowered to make a five year forecast of the financial requirements of the operation of the Grand Lodge and report its findings and recommendations to the Board of General Purposes not later than January 1987 and the subsequent recommendations to Grand Lodge.

Also, that a Special Communication of Grand Lodge be called to deal with a commitment to build as soon as the report is completed and the date of this Communication to be no later than 20 October 1986, at a place to be chosen by The Grand Master". After discussion a vote was taken and the motion was carried by a majority of the small number who voted. (less than one quarter (1/4) of 238 registered members).

BOARD OF GENERAL PURPOSES

MOST WORSHIPFUL GRAND MASTER:

I am very disturbed at the report I have just heard read, especially the last two parts, where it was stated "The approved motion regarding extension of Masonic charity (1984 Proceedings) rejected and will be readressed in June" and the "Masonic Senior Citizens Complex Study-Report tabled due to wording of subsequent motions".

I realize that motions, to table items that we don't agree with or find too controversial to deal with have become very fashionable in this Grand Lodge lately and I feel that the will of this Grand Lodge is being circumvented by these motions to table.

To refresh the memories of those present I will, with your permission, go over the sequence of events that causes me to make such a statement.

1: 1983-It was moved "that \$1500.00 from the Benevolent Fund be donated toward the Hillsborough School Choir to assist them in attaining their goal and representing us in Wales"

Doubt was expressed that such funding could come from either the Benevolent Account or the Quinn Trust Account.

It was moved "that the motion be tabled and referred to the Board of General Purposes for their investigation and action, hopefully that they will find some means of helping this choir" motion carried.

2: No action by the Board of General Purposes; no money for the choir—except what was raised when we passed the hat.

3: 1984-It was moved "that this Grand Lodge give direction to the Board of General Purposes so that they might in the ensuing year bring some recommendation to our Grand Lodge next year as to how we may remove some of those "fences", so that we may be able to extend our bounds of charity outside the Masonic Circle." Motion carried.

4: 1985-No action

5: 1986-Rejected, and will be readressed in June?

Appendix "A" (P2 of 3)

Where, in the Constitution does the Board of General Purposes get the authority to reject a motion passed by Grand Lodge?

I would like to quote from the Constitution:

"The Grand Lodge when congregated, is a presentation of every individual Brother of its jurisdiction. It is the supreme and sovereign Masonic authority, executive, legislative and judicial and is subject only to the ancient landmarks and to such limitation as it may impose upon itself or are imposed by the law of the land"

Nowhere does it say anything about the Board of General Purposes having a veto power over Grand Lodge.

I feel the Board of General Purposes has shown a disregard for the wishes of this Grand Lodge.

Secondly, I feel the Board of General Purposes has made an error in judgement on the extent of its powers for two reasons:

1: I believe that it is the duty of the Board to report to Grand Lodge any items which may have an effect on the Craft. They do this by recommending acceptance of items, by recommending rejection of items or by informing Grand Lodge that they have been unable to reach a decision on a particular subject. Then Grand Lodge will decide on which course of action to take if any. The Board has not received direction or approval from this Grand Lodge to undertake or study the question of Masonic Senior Citizen's Housing. Therefore they should bring this item or report to Grand Lodge rather than trying to make the decisions for us. Grand Lodge is not a rubber stamp for the Board of General Purposes.

2: Page 51, Section 15 of the Constitution under the heading "Of The Board Of General Purposes" states:

"The Board shall be a General Committee, to which shall be submitted all matters referred by Grand Lodge to a committee, except in cases where a special committee is appointed"

The Grand Master has appointed a special committee to study the question of Masonic Senior Citizen's Housing and I therefore feel that this committee should report directly to Grand Lodge and if more information is required the Grand Lodge will either refer it to the Board of General Purposes or to the Housing Committee or

make whatever decisions it feels necessary.

It is for these reasons that I suggest that this report of the board be rejected to voice our displeasure with the actions of the board on these two very important subjects especially the one dealing with charity in which they were given specific direction from this Grand Lodge and refused to take action.

MASONIC SENIOR CITIZEN'S HOUSING**MOST WORSHIPFUL GRAND MASTER:**

We have over the past 10 months heard much talk about Masonic Senior Citizens Housing. It has been discussed in many of the Lodges and many of the Brethren have seen the report or heard discussion on the report filed by the Housing Committee to the Board of General Purposes. We have also heard from the Board of General Purposes that it has been tabled until June. This means the earliest it can get to Grand Lodge will be May of 1987.

This matter is too important to have it "tabled to death". There is a definite need for senior's housing and we Masons are in a position where we can help. I feel as do many others that we must take our light from under the basket and allow it to shine for all the world to see.

When we install the Junior Warden we sing a song which says "Do All The Craft Uprightly Walk And Practice What They Preach". What do we preach? If we look at our ritual we find the answer.

1st Degree:

Teaching faith in God, hope in immortality and charity to all mankind (it does not say just to Masons)

The tenets of your profession as a Mason are brotherly love, relief and truth. (It does not say brotherly relief and brotherly truth.

2nd Degree:

By speculative Masonry we learn to subdue the passions, act upon the square, keep a tongue of good report, maintain secrecy and practice charity (notice it says practice charity not just think about it or just preach it and it does not limit it to Masonic charity)

Allow me to quote from the Proceedings of 1975. Most Worshipful Brother Stewart Brooks, The Grand Master, said in his address to Grand Lodge and I quote "Grand Lodges owes a very great obligation of leadership to the Craft Lodges. Are we fulfilling that obligation as we should? Are we transferring to our Lodges those principles we so often talk about so that they can be im-

plemented to the greatest effect on the Lodge?

He continues "at the beginning of every new year we should establish our goals and make every effort throughout the year to attain them"

What goals will we set here today?
