





The Financial Statement you received with the Proclamatic shows an accurate account of the Finances of Grand Lodge a December 31, 1990. They include Grand Lodge Investments well as the Profit and Loss Statement and the Benevolent Fun Investments, Revenue and Disbursements.

The Finance Committee met on several occasions during t year and fully reviewed Grand Lodge Finances. The Investmer with Investors Syndicate were reviewed and updated. We also recommend that the unconditional grant of \$550.00 be given each Lodge in the Jurisdiction and that \$20,000 again be give scholarships.

During the year, on direction of the Board of General Purp we were able to assist a Lodge in the purchase of a new build with a loan of \$10,000 at a rate favourable to both Grand Loo and the borrower.

Benevolent grants from the Fund of Benevolence have increased over the last two years, but remain only a small por of the revenue generated from this account.
