

#### ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF GENERAL PURPOSES

May 9, 1992

# TO THE GRAND LODGE OF FREE AND ACCEPTED MASONS OF NEW BRUNSWICK:

Four meetings of the Board were held during the year. At the first meeting, following Grand Lodge, the President and Vice President were elected – Deputy Grand Master – R:W: J. Ralph Andrews, President, Senior Grand Warden – R:W: Theodore C. Mills – Vice President.

A Master Masons Pocket Manual was printed and distributed to the Lodges. A number of copies are still available.

A bequest was received from the Estate of Dorothy Marshall, a relative of the late Wor. Bro. Albert Hoar, to be used for Bursaries.

It was with regret the Board received the resignation of Rt. Wor. Bro. Linkletter from the position of Chairman of Education Committee. Rt. Wor. Bro. Swetnam has agreed to continue as Chairman of the Education Committee.

The Grand Master has instituted several new programmes such as the Widows Programme whereby all Masonic Widows are presented with the Broken Column Pin, District Councils in Districts 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 and the mailing of cards to all families of deceased Masons.

In October a steering committee was set up by the Grand Master to look into and submit recommendations in an endeavor to combat anti-Masonic literature.

The Committee on Masonic Charities and Housing is still very active. Money for housing has become very tight this past year, however, the Committee is actively pursuing other avenues such as camp good time, a summer camp for children who have Cancer.

The Finance Committee has brought to our attention the fact that interest rates have dropped considerably in the last two years and many of our long-term investments, some with interest rates of 17.5%, are maturing. These will have to be reinvested at rates in the area of 8% resulting in a considerable loss in income. 14 GRAND LODGE OF NEW BRUNSWICK

During the year the Board has considered the many concerns expressed by the brethren and have endeavored, with the assistance of the various Committees, to solve the problems of concern to the best of our ability.

I would express my sincere thanks to the members of the Board who have given so freely of their time to serve the Grand Lodge.



#### **REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON FOREIGN RELATIONS**

### TO: THE MOST WORSHIPFUL THE GRAND MASTER, OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THE GRAND LODGE OF NEW BRUNSWICK F. & A.M.

This report is divided into two segments for which this Grand Lodge will be presented two separate motions for consideration. The first will deal with those Grand Lodges from who regular requests for recognition have been received.

A request for recognition has been received from the Regular Grand Lodge of Portugal, consecrated June 29, 1991, and following a review of supporting correspondence and the opinion of the Commission on Information for Recognition, this Committee recommends extending our Fraternal Recognition and the eventual exchange of Grand Representatives.

A new Grand Lodge was constituted in Brazil on Nov. 5, 1989 following the division by the Government of Brazil of the State of Goias and the creation of the new State of Tocantins. This new Grand Lodge is "Grande Loja Maconica do Estado do Tocantins" and they have requested our recognition. This Declaration of Principles is in conformity with tradition and accordingly it is recommended that Fraternal Recognition be entered into with eventual exchange of Grand Representatives.

The Grand Lodge of Uruguay has since 1988 been requesting recognition from our Grand Lodge. Delay in addressing this request has been the uncertainty of their adaption to the mandatory display of the "Volume of the Sacred Law", it being one of the conditions of regularity adopted by all regular Grand Lodges. Their lodges were given the option of placing either the "Volume of the Sacred Law" of the "Volume of the Moral Law" (Grand Constitution and Ancient Landmarks) – or both. Our understanding is that this irregularity has been corrected. A belief in the Grand Architect of the Universe is an essential requirement for their membership and that candidates are required to take their obligation on the V.S.L. in the three degrees. The Commission on Information for Recognition has verified that this is so and has indicated its opinion that the Grand Lodge or Uruguay is regular and entitled to recognition. Your Committee recommends that the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick extend recognition to the Grand Lodge of Uruguay and exchange Grand Representatives.

I hereby move that this portion of the report be received, the recommendations adopted and printed in full in the Proceedings.

The second section of this report deals with the consideration of recognition of the Most Worshipful "Prince Hall" Grand Lodge F. & A.M., Province of Ontario and Jurisdiction, which has existed in that province since 1856, being the second oldest Masonic Grand Lodge in Canada and possessing the same masonic principles and ideals of our Most worshipful Grand Lodge in Canada A.F. & A.M.

A brief background on "Prince Hall Masonry" begins in Boston, Massachusetts on March 6, 1775, when fifteen free black men, including one names Prince Hall, were initiated into Masonry by Masonic Lodge N. 441, a military lodge from the Grand Lodge of Ireland. Later these black Brethren united with other in the formation of the first lodge of Black Masons in America. First African Lodge held regular meetings from 1777 to 1787 with Prince Hall as its first Worshipful Master, and through various stages into African Grand Lodge following Ancient Custom and Usages, with Prince Hall being selected as Grand Master and upon his death it was voted to change the name to Prince Hall Grand Lodge in memory of the founder.

That Prince Hall Freemasonry is "Regular" has been established through extensive and accurate research carried out by several sources over many years; however, such a finding is not, at the moment, universally recognized. Although primarily represented in the majority of the States of the United States of America, it has other than the Grand Lodge located in Ontario, individual lodges in British Columbia and Alberta, also, in several other countries. Recent statistics show its growth to 43 Grand Lodges, 4,566 Lodges and 257,252 Members.

During the Conferences of our Grand and District Grand Lodges of Canada, held in the Spring of 1990 at Winnipeg, the subject or recognition of the Prince Hall Grand Lodge F. & A.M., Province of Ontario and Jurisdiction, received lengthy and serious attention, with Canadian consensus targeted for the 1992 Conference. Subsequent to those meetings a dialogue team made up of a representative of the Grand Lodge of Quebec and the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge F. & A.M., Province of Ontario and Jurisdiction produced a position paper on the subject with the objective of providing some information which might be useful to our Canadian Grand Lodges to view the situation as it is and not how some uninformed Masons have described it.

On August 13, 1991 a resolution was passed by the M:W: Prince Hall Grand Lodge F. & A.M., Province of Ontario and Jurisdiction, in order to establish a more perfect brotherhood, and agreed to accord fraternal recognition for the purposes of intervisitation to all, or any, of our nine Canadian Grand Lodges F. & A.M., which may wish to accord reciprocal fraternal recognition to the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge F. & A.M. Province of Ontario and Jurisdiction.

Again, at Winnipeg on March 31, 1992, the Conference of our Grand and District Grand Lodges resumed extensive discussion on this topic, concluding with the unanimous recommendation of the acceptance of Prince Hall Grand Lodges – (as approved by the Conference of Prince Hall Grand Lodges) – as being regular Masonic Grand Lodges.

Accordingly, I move that the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, F. & A.M. accord reciprocal Fraternal Recognition for the purposes of "Inter-Visitation" with the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge, F. & A.M., Province of Ontario and Jurisdiction.

#### **REPORT OF THE MASONIC EDUCATION COMMITTEE - 1991**

It is my pleasure, on behalf of the members of you Grand Lodge Education Committee, to submit the following report summarizing the activities of this committee since the last Grand Lodge sessions.

Unfortunately, due to family commitments, R.W. Bro. Maurice Linkletter found it necessary to withdraw as Chairman, although he remained active on the committee. His position was assumed by R.W. Bro. Michael Swetnam. It was with regret that we saw R.W. Bro. Linkletter resign, for his guidance, knowledge and experience have benefitted the Masons of New Brunswick for a number of years.

The Committee met five times in the past year for the purpose of developing a manual of instruction for lodge officers. We were fortunate in that we had a model to follow, that being the excellent Officer's Course which had been prepared by Carleton Lodge #35, and for which we again say thanks. We are pleased to inform you that the new Manual for officers has been completed and has been delivered to the District Deputy Grand Masters for distribution to the various Lodges in their Districts. Initially each Lodge will receive eleven copies with one additional being supplied every year thereafter, all at no cost to the Lodge.

You will note that is is in loose-leaf format rather than being bound or stapled. This will allow additions and updates, which will be provided from time to time by the Education Committee, to be inserted as they are received. There is space at the margin for notes which officers may make to suit their individual needs. We realize that this Manual will not be all things to all Officers and will leave some questions unanswered. For this reason, it is the request of the Education Committee that each Officer who receives this Manual read it carefully and make not of those subjects which he wishes had been more fully explained. These items can be discussed at future District Council meetings and recommendations made to the District Deputies, all of whom are members of this Committee.

Your Committee appointed to award the Grand Lodge bursaries for 1991 – 1992 met in Moncton on August 14, 1991 and reviewed and evaluated the 73 applications received. After due and careful consideration, the committee awarded 20 Masonic bursaries of \$1,000.00 each. I also attended the installation of officers of the Westmorland Assembly #23, International Order of the Rainbow for Girls in Riverview. Brethren, we could take a lesson or two from these young girls in the of fund-raising. In the last\_13 years\_they have raised\_\$23,000\_for various charities.

#### ALL CANADA CONFERENCE

The jurisdiction was represented this year by your Grand Master and Deputy Grand Master, R.W. Bro. Ralph Andrews. W. Bro. Bernus Clarke, Assistant Grand Secretary was unable to attend because of illness in his family.

As usual, all jurisdictions across Canada were represented by their Grand Masters, District Grand Masters, Deputy Grand Masters and Grand Secretaries. Observers were also present from some Canadian jurisdictions and also from the U.S.A. An innovative change to the agenda this year was introduced. Each Grand Master or his representative presented a 10 minute paper on programmes that had been tried in the past five years. Whether successful or not, after which there was a question and answer period.

After digesting the information presented by all papers, I am very proud to tell you, that in the area of programmes undertaken and progress achieved, this jurisdiction is among those at the top. Not bad for what I believe to be the second smallest membership in Canada! But, we must not rest on our oars!!

This year's Conference was an historic milestone in Canadian Masonry. After three years of discussion, a consensus was finally reached concerning the issue of Prince Hall Masonry being identified as "Regular".

The following motion was passed in total unanimity and amity: "The conference of Grand and District Grand and District Grand Lodges of Canada held in Winnipeg on March 21, 1992 unanimously recommends the acceptance of Prince Hall Grand Lodges, as being "Regular" Masonic Grand Lodges"

I doubt if I will ever be as proud in the future to be a mason as I was at the moment the gravel dropped to pass this motion. We finally practiced what we preach.

The way has now been cleared for each jurisdiction in Canada to initiate negotiations with Prince Hall Grand Lodges. My personal, and masonic opinions on this issue are well known and I will be moving to initiate negotiations with the most worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge, free and accepted Masons, Province of Ontario and Jurisdiction.

Prior to the closing of the conference, the slate of officers were chosen for the coming year, with your Grand Master being installed as Vice-President. While the executive officers are rotated through all jurisdictions over a period of time, I nevertheless consider it an honour.

#### PROGRAMMES

In May 1991 we laid out a blueprint of nine programmes to initiate movement to unify all Lodges in purpose in direction and to re-generate masonic belief, dedication, interest and activity. These programmes are as noted below:

- 1. To form District Councils.
- 2. To create a uniform Widows' Programme to enlarge and enhance our Masonic Community.
- 3. To stress the essential need for a higher quality of leadership at all levels.
- 4. To adopt a charity of charities.
- 5. To have all lodges research and compile their histories.
- 6. To take masonry to, and interact with, the public on a much larger scope.
- 7. To increase the size and scope of "Mostly Masonry".
- 8. To initiate support for youth groups.
- To monitor and further Masonic Education by having each D.D.G.M. appoint a District Education Officer for his district.

These programmes are all enjoying varying degrees of progress, but continued success will call for constant monitoring during the next two or three years until they become ingrained into the operation of all lodges.

## DISTRICT DEPUTY GRAND MASTERS

It is a known historical fact that District Deputy Grand Masters are the work horses, eyes and ears that keep the Grand Master informed about what is happening in his jurisdiction.

As Grand Master, I have been singularly blessed because, without the total dedication, support and team effort on the part of our D.D.G.M.'s. The programmes we have undertaken would not be enjoying the levels of success they have reached.

At the risk of incurring the ire of my predecessors and that of the preceding D.D.G.M.'s, I feel that I have the greatest team ever to be associated with: and I express my deepest appreciation for your co-operation and all-out effort.

#### **GENERAL COMMENTS**

Masonry is definitely moving forward in our jurisdiction at an accelerating pace: some lodges more quickly than others. This is a natural phenomenon due to many factors such as size, locality, wealth, and so on; but, overall, we are moving forward. We have a large number of masters whose ages range from 29 to 45 and their energy, Zeal and innovative spirit are beginning to be felt throughout this jurisdiction.

Two or three lodges who were struggling are being assisted to their feet and into the main stream of movement by dedicated Brethren who have affiliated with them and are showing the way by boosting morale and re-engendering interest and activity.

My most sincere "Thanks" and appreciation to these Brethren for their dedication to their brothers and masonry. This is brotherly love personified.

I would be terribly remiss if I did not express my heartfelt gratitude to R.W. Bro. Ralph Andrews, W. Bro. Graham Pelley, and R.W. Bro. Douglas Mayes.

R.W. Bro. Andrews doubled this year as Deputy Grand Master and acting Grand Secretary, filling both positions with his usual excellent performance. I shudder to think of how the installation of officers would have turned out in January without his coaching.

#### ANNUAL REPORT 1991 – 1992 NEW BRUNSWICK MASONIC CHARITIES AND HOUSING COMPANY LIMITED

The Board of Directors met twice this past year; Oromocto and Boistown. The executive also had an additional meeting in June 1992 in St. John.

Right Worshipful Brother Frank Langley, Chairman of Quinn House Committee and a member of St. Marks Lodge No. 5 reported that all apartments continue to be occupied by the same tenants. Management of the complex has been administered by a committee of three members of St. Marks Lodge. This committee has been responsible for the day to day operation of the residence. The committee also supervises janitor services including all required maintenance. Accounting procedures were changed in 1991 and the use of a local accountant was discontinued.

Favourable comments continue to be heard concerning Quinn House and it is still considered to be offering the highest standard of seniors housing to be found in the area.

Brethren since I last reported the Board has actively pursued the goal of developing four Masonic seniors residences within our Province. Two communities that were investigated in this regard were Pert-Andover and Campbellton. Members of the board met with the Lodges in those locations to determine if they would be interested and prepared to undertake the action necessary to submit an application of construction of a seniors complex in their area. Changes in the New Brunswick Housing Act requires that all submissions of this nature must be undertaken by local bodies. We as a third party are no longer able to act as the principle, although we can assist local Lodges by providing financial and administrative assistance as well as advice and active support where needed. Only limited funds are currently available due to the present financial climate within our Province. We recognize this fact and realize it will be some time before the situation improves. The Board therefore decided to concentrate on the charitable aspect of our mandate. In the past we had supported Camp Goodtime, a summer camp for children suffering from cancer. The Board agreed we should contact each Lodge within our Jurisdiction soliciting their support for this worth while project and it is the Boards hope that Lodges will accept support of Camp Goodtime as an annual project.

We hope that Camp Goodtime will become recognized as a Masonic project and towards this end it is hoped that Lodge members will be allowed to publicly raise funds in support of Camp Goodtime thus projecting a positive image of Masonry within our communities. To date One Thousand and Fifty Dollars have been donated by a number of Lodges. Our objective is Six Thousand Dollars.

We are studying the possibility of providing "Hot Meals" to underprivileged children in communities where service can be provided by existing school staff. In this regard we hope to encourage local Lodges to advise us if there is a need in their area.

Our Board further agreed that we should encourage the use of the Masonic Charities and Housing Company memorial cards. as our finances improve so will our ability to respond and thus broaden the range of our charitable activities. Through such actions it is hoped that our Masonic Order will be viewed as a viable, positive and active force for good within our communities.

Brethren as President of our worthy Corporation I wish to thank all those who have assisted me during my term of Office. I will be stepping down as President in the very near future. It is time for new leadership as well as new ideas. I will however stay active within the Corporation as long as I am needed. My lifestyle requires that I take more time for my family and our goals for the next few years.

#### REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

#### TO: THE MOST WORSHIPFUL GRAND MASTER, OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THE ANCIENT AND HONOURABLE FRATERNITY OF FREE AND ACCEPTED MASONS OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

During the past year we received a bequest from the estate of the late Dorothy Rosenell Marshall. This bequest is for \$10,500.00 and was given in the memory of Wor. Bro. Albert Gilbert Hoar.

By the conditions of the will the \$500.00 is to be held in trust and the income therefrom to assist<sup>\*</sup>a DeMolay student in New Brunswick. The \$10,000.00 to be invested and the proceeds to be used to provide scholarships for the sons of Masons in Saint John.

This bequest has been invested in accordance with the conditions of the will of the late Dorothy Rosenell Marshall.

During the past year we were again able to assist a lodge with a loan to assist them in improvements to their lodge buildings. This loan has been repaid including interest due.

During the past several years interest rates have declined dramatically During the past year and early part of this year many of our high interest investments have matured. These have been redeemed and reinvested at current rates, as much as 50% below the old rates. This loss of interest income combined with a projected loss of fees and dues will result in a dramatic loss of operating income for the Grand Lodge.

In January the budget for this fiscal year was presented to the Board of General Purposes and was adopted and approved. This budget projected expenditures to exceed the projected revenues from fees, dues and interest income from the Grand Lodge Investment Account. However, by exercising fiscal restraint and the transfer of surplus fund from the Fund of Benevolence all financial obligations can be met.

Bearing in mind the Financial constraints on Grand Lodge this committee makes the following recommendations.

#### **REPORT OF THE GRAND HISTORIAN**

#### TO: THE MOST WORSHIPFUL GRAND MASTER, MEMBERS OF THE GRAND LODGE

In this our 125th year as a Grand Lodge it is important that we reflect on our past so we can have a better appreciation of our present. We can also look to the future with the knowledge that masonry has survived many things and as a result is better prepared to meet the future challenges. First though a look at some of the highlights of our past year.

A major project of the Most Worshipful Grand Master has resulted in the formation of District Councils throughout the jurisdiction. These councils have provided a mechanism to bring the Lodges in a district together several times a year to share information, to share in education and to generate interest in projects that will promote masonry.

Another program developed this year highlights the widows of Masons. Many Lodges have used the widows pins and have had special nights to honour these ladies.

In November the DeMolay for boys was brought back to the Province and to the Moncton area with the official formation of the Phil Drader – Coronation Chapter. The initiation was done by members of Frank S. Land DeMolay Chapter from Portland Maine. The new Chapter meets at the Coverdale Masonic Temple and all Masons are invited to their meetings on the second Tuesday and the fourth Wednesday.

The Education Committee completed and published a major reference manual for the Officers of the Lodges. The manual provides information on all aspects of running a lodge as well as the conduct of meetings. Its use will ensure more uniformity within the jurisdiction.

During this term the Grand Lodge was saddened by the passing of our Grand Secretary Right Worshipful Brother Stirling M. Scribner. Right Worshipful Brother Scribner was our first Assistant Grand Secretary and was in his first year as Grand Secretary. His death left a large void in this operation of the Grand Lodge.

In August of 1867 members of the seven Lodges in the Saint John area met, "to consider the present altered position of the Masonic status in this Province, consequent upon the confederation of the Provinces of Canada." From this meeting an invitation was sent to all twenty six Lodges in the Province to gather in October to discuss their status. There were twenty Lodges on the English Registry, three on the Scottish Registry and three on the Irish registry. The proposal sent out was asking for discussion on the formation of a Grand Lodge in New Brunswick.

On October 9, 1867 nineteen Lodges gathered in Saint John in a Masonic Convention to discuss the problem of several Grand Lodges having the right to issue warrants in the Province. When the vote was take to form a Grand Lodge of New Brunswick sixteen Lodges voted in favour, three Lodges abstained because the members felt their Lodges had not given them a mandate to vote on the motion.

The installation of Most Worshipful Brother B. Lester Peters and the other Officers of the first Grand Lodge of New Brunswick was conducted on January 22, 1868. At this time twenty two Lodges were included. The first Communication of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick was held September 23 and 24, 1868 with twenty four Lodges in the fold. Lodge Saint John in Bathurst and Lodge Saint Andrews in Fredericton, both on the Scottish Registry, did not join until 1871 and 1872.

Of the twenty six Lodges only two have completely closed, Midian No 9 and Leinster No 19, two others joined together to make one lodge. Saint Andrews No 29 joined Solomans No 6 to form Hiram No 6 in Fredericton.

1784 to 1825 16 Lodges were made 2 remain. 1825 to 1862 24 Lodges were made 21 remain. 1867 to present 29 Lodges made 28 remain. Blackville No 43 closed.

In total there have been 69 Lodges in New Brunswick with 51 remaining. This is a very good record.

In the history of Grand Lodge there have been fifty-four Grand Masters, but only fourteen Grand Secretaries. J. Twining Hart served forty years as Grand Secretary.
