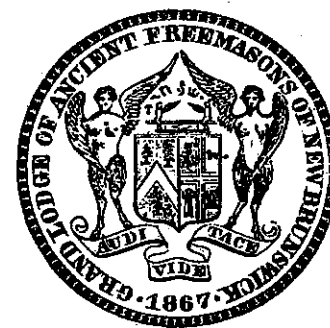

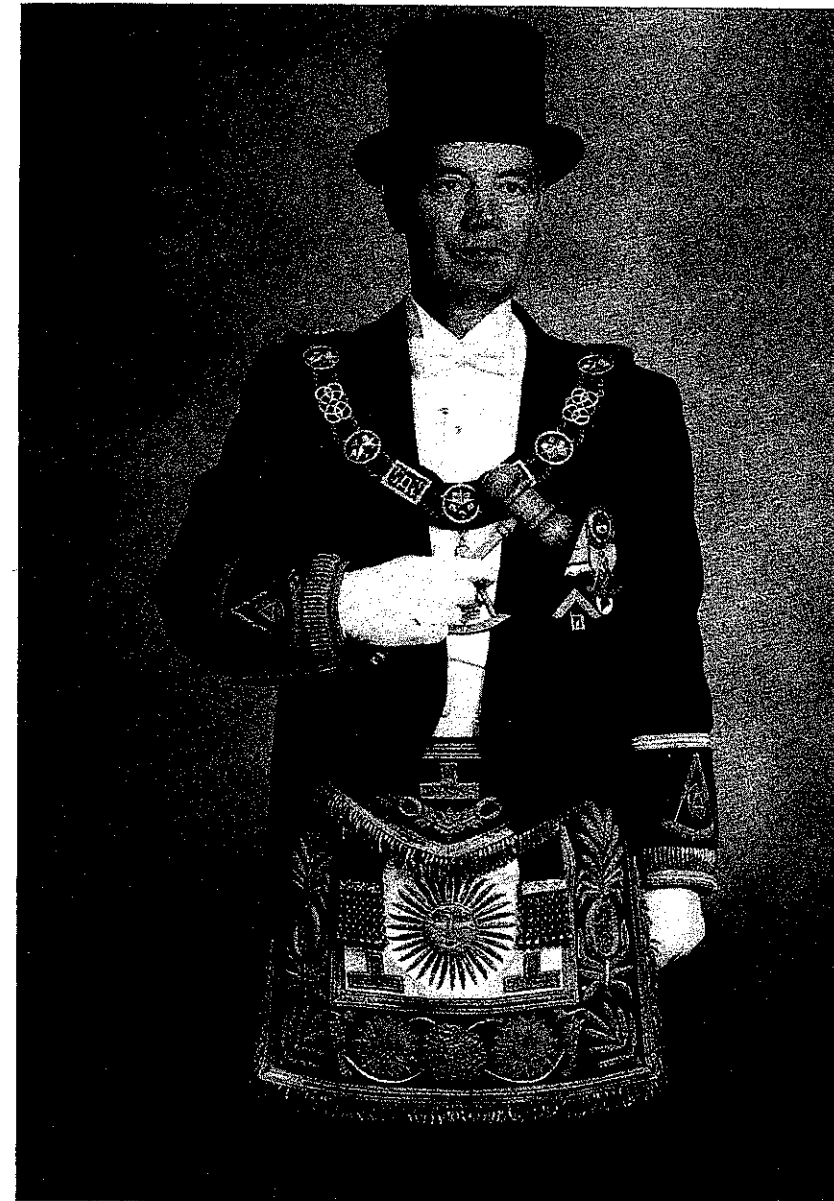

Regular Meetings of the Board were held June 25/94, October 22/94, January 28/95 and March 4/95. A very good attendance was recorded at all Board Meetings.

M:W:B: Carr Ward Graham called the June meeting to order and R:W:B: William H. Balser, Jr. was appointed Chairman and R:W:B: George E. Trentowsky was elected Deputy Chairman.

The report of the committee on The Grand Lodge Communication was received and preparations made to proceed with the 128th Grand Lodge Communication.

It was with regret that the Board received a letter from R:W:B: Doug Mayes resigning from the Board of General Purposes. A vote of thanks was extended to R:W:B: Mayes for his past services and outstanding efforts in the planning and arrangements for the very successful Grand Lodge Communications.

Grand Lodge Aprons were purchased for the Grand Piper and The Deputy Grand Secretary.

Procedures for the purchase of Masonic Books via The Grand Lodge was reviewed.

The Grand Secretary was authorized to refurbish the Beardsley Plaque at Trinity Church, Kingston, N.B. and make plans for a rededication service.

The use of Voice Mail for Lodge meeting notices was not approved at the present time.

R:W:B: M. Swetnam made a presentation "To decode or not to decode that is the question".

The topic of forming an Eastern Conference of Grand Masters was received from the Grand Lodge of Quebec and referred to committee for study.

A blanket Insurance Policy to cover liability, regalia, and property for all Lodges in the Jurisdiction was forwarded to the Finance Committee for study.

At the October meeting a very favourable report was received on the rededication service held in the Trinity Anglican Church, Kingston, N.B. in memory of B: John Beardsly. The sermon delivered by the Grand Chaplain together with a pamphlet "A response to the Critics of Freemasonry" to be sent to each Mason in the Jurisdiction.

The Grand Master was authorized to attend the Conference of Grand Masters of North America in Fargo, N.D. USA and The Grand Master and The Deputy Grand Master or Grand Secretary attend the Canadian Conference in Winnipeg, Manitoba.

Camp Goodtime was reported to be a great success this past year and fund raising was well under way for next year.

A carrying case for the Grand Lodge flags was presented to Grand Lodge by R:W:B: Simon MacDonald.

It was agreed that the decoding of the Ritual not be acted upon until ratified by Grand Lodge.

Progress reports were received in January on the Blanket Insurance Policy and the Proposed Eastern Conference of Grand Masters.

Grand Lodge will cover the cost of two members of the Order of DeMolay to attend leadership camp in New Hampshire, USA. The cost to be \$1000.00.

In March it was reported that the proposed Eastern Conference of Grand Masters will hold an organizational meeting in Saint John April 11 and 12th, 1995.

The report on the 128th Communication stated that everything was proceeding as planned.

It has been a very busy and informative year. Many concerns were expressed by our Brethren and it is hoped that with the assistance of the various committees that the Board has dealt with these concerns to the best of its ability.

Personally, I would like to thank R:W:B: Andrews and R:W:B: Clark, they made my job as Chairman much easier. I would also like to express my thanks to all the Members for their interest and devotion to the Fraternity.

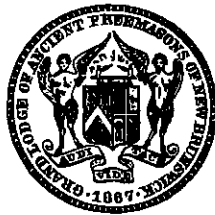

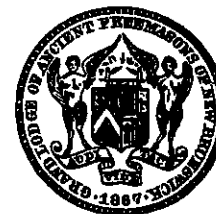

GOOD OF THE ORDER

Concerns are expressed about the gradual decline in membership. It is not as rapid as it has been but we are not showing any increase. There is a certain amount of satisfaction in the increase in activity with the Lodges, both in attendance of Brethren at meetings and the number of applicants joining the Fraternity. I believe much of the credit for this can be given to

Camp Goodtime, our camp for children afflicted with cancer, where the Brethren are working together, with a common goal, to make the lives of these children a little closer to that of a healthy child. In areas where DeMolay for Boys is active, membership interest in the Lodge is also increased.

We received with regret the decision of Bethel Lodge #40 that they are no longer able to continue and wish to surrender their Charter. On the brighter side, we have a request from the Brethren of Campobello Island to establish a Lodge in their area. This request is now in the hands of the Committee on Warrants for their recommendations.

Our Grand Lodge participated in the All-Canada Conference in Winnipeg, March 17 and 18. Representatives from all Jurisdictions across Canada were in attendance. Since our last Grand Lodge Communication, the Board of Directors has met on four occasions at Oromocto, Newcastle, Woodstock and Fredericton. Attendance at these meetings has been good.

Camp Goodtime for the second time was held in New Brunswick at Camp Glenburn with fifty-one children attending and from all accounts was most successful. During Sponsor Day, a good number of the Brethren were given the opportunity to tour the Camp which provides ample facilities for campers. The cost for the 1994 Camp was \$16,000.00 and was held July 3 to 9, 1994. Plans are well under way for the 1995 Camp again being held at Camp Glenburn on June 25th to July 1st. The cost of this year's Camp will be \$17,000.00 which will be met. We are hoping to have another Sponsor's Day with treats being supplied to the children.

The success that Camp Goodtime has enjoyed is attributable to the wonderful support received from Lodges, individual Masons and Concordant bodies. We are the principal sponsors of Camp Goodtime and are being recognized as such. It may be that Camp Goodtime is as great a benefit to Masonry as Masonry may be to Camp Goodtime.

In 1994, the Board of Directors received a request for financial assistance from the New Brunswick Chapter of the Canadian Deafblind and Rubella Association. At first, little was known of this Association but after Mrs. Patricia Curtis, the Executive Director, appeared before two District Council Meetings, Nos. 1 and 6 at The Corinthian Lodge and Hiram Lodge where she gave a most informative talk and showed a video of the Camp. Not only did we have our eyes opened but our hearts touched. The Board approved funds of \$1,300.00 to enable two deafblind youths to attend their Camp in 1994. This money was taken from Company funds and not from any funds received in support of Camp Goodtime, our principal project.

The Board directed that a letter be sent to each Lodge to ascertain if the Masons of New Brunswick are prepared to expand upon their charitable activities by allowing the Board to support

other worthy children oriented projects such as the Deafblind and Rubella Camp. Responses to date have been favourable and encouraging.

Quinn House in St. Andrews continues to be operated in a most efficient manner for which we thank R:W:B: Frank Langley. Occupancy is at capacity with a waiting list.

I would be remiss if I did not thank the Board Members for their dedicated support over the past year and on their behalf to thank most sincerely everyone who has supported our charitable activities.

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

TO: THE MOST WORSHIPFUL THE GRAND MASTER, OFFICERS

The Financial Statement of the Masonic Grand Lodge
Corporation, presented earlier in the day by the Grand Treasurer,
shows the finances of Grand Lodge for the year ending 31
December, 1994. This statement includes both income and
expenditures for the past two years as well as investments in both
accounts.

During the past year we have experienced a drop in income
both from dues as well as from investment income. During the past
two years we have occurred a small surplus of income over
expenditures. This has been achieved by restraint in all aspects of
Grand Lodge spending.

During the past year we received a bequest from the Estate of
Dorothy R. Marshall. This brings to a total of \$16,788 left by her to
Grand Lodge in memory of W:B: Albert Hoar. This bequest has
been invested in the Albert Hoar Trust Account according to the
provisions of her will.

During the past year the Finance Committee met on a number
of occasions and reviewed Grand Lodge Investments. Some
Investments have been changed to achieve maximum returns as
well as to provide a better cash flow. Most Investments are now in
the short or medium ranges and are in G.I.C.'s or Government
Bonds.

During the past year we are able to assist another Lodge by
providing financial assistance to aid them in renovating their Lodge
premises. We believe this type of financial aid in the form of low
interest loans to be an investment in the future of Masonry and
recommend this practice continue if finances permit.

We, again, recommend that Bursaries amounting to
\$10,000.00 be given to deserving students and this amount be
taken from the Fund of Benevolence.

We also recommend that Bursaries be given from the Albert
Hoar Trust Account to those who qualify.

We, again, recommend that an unconditional grant of \$550.00 be given to each Lodge in the Grand Jurisdiction.
