

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF GENERAL PURPOSES

May 1996

TO: THE MOST WORSHIPFUL THE GRAND MASTER, OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THE GRAND LODGE OF NEW BRUNSWICK F. & A. M.:

During the past year four (4) meetings of the Board were held. They were on June 24, 1995; October 21, 1995; February 3, 1996; and March 9, 1996.

The June meeting was called to order by M:W:B: William H. Balser, Jr., who presided during the election of R:W:B: George E. Trentowsky, D.G.M., as Chairman and R:W:B: Evan W. Thomas, S.G.W., as Vice-Chairman.

A report was received on the 128th Communication and preparations made to proceed with the 129th Grand Lodge Communication.

A report on a survey sent out to the Lodges concerning the purchase of blanket insurance was received. The tentative start date for the Insurance program was set for October 1, 1995.

The Eastern Conference of Grand Masters was given support.

A motion was approved recommending the Grand Master appoint representatives for Prince Hall Masonry. Use of the road signs was approved.

The Ritual Committee was given permission to change the Ritual to read that the Master proclaim that the candidate has passed a satisfactory examination.

At our October meeting it was recommended that the Grand Lodge Ragalia be examined and an amount budgeted for each year to repair or replace existing Regalia and that a complete set of Undress Regalia be eventually purchased.

R:W:B: Healey reported that during his decoding of the Ritual he found various mistakes.

The decoding of the Ritual is now completed and he recommends to this Board that it recommend to Grand Lodge the adoption of this Ritual as the official Ritual of The Grand Lodge of New Brunswick. This and the work of the Ritual Committee were approved.

A recommendation of the Jurisprudence Committee for Voting Cards at Grand Lodge sessions was approved.

Also, a ruling given by the Solicitor, on the Albert Hoar Memorial Bequest, was accepted.



A recommendation that the wearing of Masonic Regalia at DeMolay or Rainbow Girls' functions was approved.

The Jurisprudence Committee's recommendation that the matter of the Directive on Examinations of Candidates or the three Degrees be taken to the Grand Lodge sessions for a decision was accepted.

The Jurisprudence Committee was given approval to continue with Constitution revisions. The following recommendations were made to the Board by the Jurisprudence Committee:

- 1) The Ritual Committee Chairman be made a Grand Lodge Officer.
- 2) That Grand Lodge have an Official Solicitor.

R:W:B: Thomas reported that the Education Committee is waiting for feedback on the proficiency in Lodge Management and recommended the Grand Lodge furnish one copy of the 101+ Ways to Improve Interest and Attendance in Your Masonic Lodge to all Lodges with a few copies for the Grand Lodge Library. Approval to do so from the Education Committee budget was given.

The Board approved the sending of the Grand Master and Grand Secretary to the North American Conference of Grand Masters and Grand Secretaries if they so desired.

Also, the sending of the Grand Master, Deputy Grand Master and Grand Secretary to the Canadian Grand Masters Conference in Winnipeg if they so desire.

It was suggested the following be included in Mostly Masonry.

- 1) Name and address of the Educational Officer.
- 2) Each new member be listed and welcomed to the fraternity.
- A memorial section listing our deceased brethren.
 The February meeting brought forth the following: New Rituals be sold for ten dollars.

The preparation of a check list to be used by Investigating Committees, but prepared by the Jurisprudence Committee.

A framed copy of a cheque presentation by the Grand Master to the Cancer Society at Grand Lodge was presented by R:W:B: Winters.

R:W:B: Rideout suggested the Renewal Committee be made an Official Committee of Grand Lodge.

The Board approved support for the Saint John Regional Hospital Cardiac Care Unit with a cheque for \$2,000.00

A letter to go out to all Lodges who have not made their annual report or paid their Grand Lodge dues informing them they will not be eligible to participate in the Grand Lodge meeting unless these are completed prior to the times stated in the Constitution.

At the March meeting:

A report of the Jurisprudence Committee stated that a notice of motion was being prepared to have the new Ritual regarded as a regulation, thereby making it necessary to have a two-thirds majority vote to make any changes. Also, that another motion would be prepared regarding the matter of those running for a Grand Lodge Office.

In discussion on publicity several members referred to the 150th Anniversary of Sussex Lodge #7 at St. Stephen on March 4th and the good public relations that developed from this event.

R:W:B: Pike outlined plans for the Guest and Entertainment that has been arranged for the Grand Lodge sessions.

Zion Lodge #21 has indicated that they will be presenting a brief on the use of the Computer Internet and it was agreed that the Board endeavour to get information on the matter.

On the questions as to the seating of District Deputies. It was noted that the Manual for Officers was in disagreement with the Constitution.

The Board affirmed the Constitution is correct. It was also agreed the District Deputy should sit on the right of the Worshipful Master except during Grand Lodge of Grand Lodge Visits when he will sit on the left of the Worshipful Master.



The age limit to be received into Masonry to remain at twenty-one.


Your committee is pleased to note that where vacancies of Grand Representatives have occurred, your recommendations of appointments have gone forward promptly to the respective Grand Jurisdictions, with a timely follow-up where necessary by the Grand. Secretary. It is, therefore, disappointing despite mutual understanding that appointments of Grand Representative would be exchanged, that occasionally either names or certificates are not forthcoming.

A request for recognition has been received from the Grande Loja do Parana, Brazil. This Grand Lodge is considered as Regular and adheres to the basic standards for Recognition. Therefore, it is the Committee's recommendation that the Grande Loja du Parana, Brazil, be recognized by the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick and Representatives be exchanged.

Similarly, the Grand Lodge of the State of Sao Paulo, Brazil requests recognition; is considered Regular and satisfies the standards for recognition. Accordingly, it is the Committee's recommendation that the Grand Lodge of the State of Sao Paulo, Brazil, be recognized by the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick and Representatives be exchanged.

A noteworthy request for recognition has been received from the Grand Lodge of Russia, regularly constituted by the Grande Loge National Francais in Moscow on 24 June 1995. It currently follows the principles and practices of the Grande Loge National Francais. This is a new Grand Lodge claiming sole jurisdiction of freemasonry over the territory of the Russian Federation. It consists of four Lodges and a membership of 102 on the 12th day of January, 1996. It advises that the Standards of Recognition are followed. Before making a recommendation, your committee awaits further information on this new Grand Lodge.

The Grand Lodge of North of Colombia, established at the City of Barranquilla, Colombia in 1989, have written that they would like to start, as they phrase it, an "Epistolary Relationship" –

REPORT OF THE JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

TO: THE MOST WORSHIPFUL THE GRAND MASTER, OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THE GRAND LODGE OF NEW BRUNSWICK F. & A. M.

During the past year the following items were referred to this Committee for study and clarification or originated in the Jurisprudence Committee and presented to the Board of General Purposes as a recommendation.

Referred to this Committee;

- 1. A voting card of some distinctive colour to be used for voting at Grand Lodge. This committee recommends their use.
- 2. Interpretation of what the Albert Hoar bequest was really saying. Our solicitor, Bro. Allaby, assisted us greatly in this matter.
- 3. The wearing of Masonic Ragalia at DeMolay or Rainbow Girls functions. This committee recommends use only on special occasions by permission of the Grand Master.
- 4. The Directive which states that candidates be instructed in and examined on the Obligation of the three Degrees. This committee recommends that this matter be returned to the Grand Lodge for a decision.
- Adoption of new Ritual. This committee recommends the adoption at Grand Lodge of this new decoded Ritual as the official Ritual of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick.
- 6. Investigation Check List. This committee recommends such a list be prepared.
- 7. Revising of the Constitution. This committee recommends that this process continue and has taken the step of re-arranging the format of the Constitution so as to make it easier to locate required information and read. The computer was used in the process for storage of info to be used in re-arrangements.

Recommendations Originating from this Committee;

- 1. That this Grand Lodge have an official Solicitor.
- 2. The Ritual Committee Chairman be made an Officer of the Grand Lodge.
- 3. That changes to the Ritual require a ²/3^{rds} vote of members present by making the Ritual part of the Constitution.

I would like to thank all the members of this committee for their keen interest and enthusiasm in the work of this committee especially Bro. Cedric Allaby, our Solicitor.

REPORT ON DEMOLAY

TO: THE MOST WORSHIPFUL THE GRAND MASTER,
OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THE GRAND LODGE OF
NEW BRUNSWICK F. & A. M.

DeMolay is on the move in New Brunswick. Next weekend, Canadian Supreme Council and The Canadian DeMolay Parliament, will meet in Moncton for their annual meeting. This is a first for New Brunswick and certainly a well deserved honour not only for the boys but for the Masons of New Brunswick who support them. Many areas of the province have expressed interest in starting their own Chapter of DeMolay. Where ever the boys travel they stir up interest and gain the respect of those who see them.

Since being appointed as your liaison to DeMolay I have found that it is impossible for me to take the role of a bystander or reporter. The more I become involved with DeMolay the more I want to do. The enthusiasm of the boys is contagious.

When DeMolay was restarted in Moncton in 1991, they asked for the assistance of this Grand Lodge and many of the subordinant Lodges. That support enabled them to grow and improve and reach out the hand of brotherhood to many boys who might otherwise not of been able to afford it. This Grand Lodge should take great pride in the many accomplishments of New Brunswick DeMolay because without their assistance none of this would have happened.

DeMolays can only hold membership for a few years from age 13 until they turn 21. This means that they must be continually finding new members. This becomes almost a full time job. Add to this the fact that many boys come from broken homes or dysfunctional families and you can see how important it is to have the support of every Masonic Body in the Jurisdiction. DeMolay in this area is lucky to have the support of not only the Grand Master, who is a senior DeMolay, they also have received the support of many other Masons, who are also leaders in many of the concordant bodies.

Although DeMolay are not "junior Masons", they have a great deal of respect for those who are willing to take the time and



trouble to be part of their world. As the years progress this respect turns into friendship and they want to join the same organizations that their friends belong to. If the past is any indication of the future, we will realize a great benefit from our support of DeMolay In Maine, 66% of the members of DeMolay who reach the age of majority join the Masonic Order. Many members of this Grand Lodge have held membership in DeMolay. Just think of how fortunate a small lodge would be to get three or four young men, who are proven ritualists, able leaders and willing workers. DeMolay can deliver them to you if you give it time. Another benefit is that some of the parents are also impressed by what we teach the boys and find themselves drawn to Masonry. We have at least six new Masons in New Brunswick directly attributed to the 13 boys that you helped 5 years ago.

Our leaders cannot do it all for us. We each must make a commitment to support the youth in our communities, whether it be DeMolay, Rainbow for girls or any other youth oriented organization. It does not take much to start DeMolay in your area. Two or three Masons who like to work with young people and two or three boys who are of good character, believe in God and want to improve themselves and have fun while doing it. The rest is easy. If you want more information just ask one of the DeMolay boys or their Advisors and they will do the rest.

I want to personally thank the Most Worshipful Grand Master for this appointment. It is one of the most satisfying that I have ever had. The only problem I have is that I enjoy it too much. These young men may well be the future of Masonry. I believe it is our responsibility and our duty to do everything possible to ensure that Masonry survives intact into the next century.

Your committee on Masonic Education has nearly completed Part II of the "Proficiency in Lodge Management" program. We will soon have this program in publication and distribution. Again this is a self-guiding study program for use by all members of this Grand Lodge. It is however, particularly directed toward senior lodge officers such as Masters and Wardens, with particular emphasis on planning and preparing Lodge programs.

In addition to the Grand Lodge Constitution, Ritual and Officer's Manual used in part I of this program, "The Master's Book" by Claudy and "101+ Ways to Improve Interest & Attendance in Your Masonic Lodge" by The Masonic Renewal Committee of North America Inc., are included in the bibliography for part II. Copies of these books have recently been provided to each Lodge and should be made available to all members participating in this program as well as those who are preparing for their year as Worshipful Master.

It is worth noting that these programs along with the "Mentor Program" and other materials, published by the Education Committee, are intended to enhance the educational abilities of District and Lodge Officers. Thus, the information contained in these materials, might be used in a variety of ways for the on-going education of all members of the craft, without being limited solely to the format in which they were originally written.

The Education Committee has been represented at all of the Grand Master's Official Visits. We were privileged to make reports or presentations at many of them. Feedback from these reports and presentations indicates an increasing awareness of the importance and necessity of continuous Masonic education.

The Education Committee has been represented on the recently formed Masonic Renewal Committee of New Brunswick. Because of the obvious link between education and the successful implementation of programs developed by the Renewal Committee, it is recommended that this representation be continued throughout the life of that committee.

BRETHREN:

Best wishes and a warm welcome is extended to everyone on the occasion of the 129th Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick. A very special welcome to our guests from other Grand Jurisdictions. Kathy and I have enjoyed our visits with you and look forward to extending, to you, the hospitality of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick.

It seems like only yesterday that I attended the 107th Annual Communication as the Master of Howard Lodge #15. In 1974 I felt very honoured and privileged to sit in this Grand Lodge Room. I have that same feeling today. It is with great humility that I sit here today as your Grand Master and to have the honour and privilege to preside over this Annual Communication. I was a bit nervous in 1974 when I entered this room for the first time and I may be just a bit nervous today.

ANNUAL REPORT 1995 – 1996 NEW BRUNSWICK MASONIC CHARITIES AND HOUSING COMPANY LIMITED

This year marks the tenth anniversary for New Brunswick Masonic Charities and Housing Company Ltd. having been formed in 1986 under authority of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick and incorporated as a Company by the Province of New Brunswick.

Many obstacles has to be overcome in our early years amongst which was acquiring our Charitable Registration number from the Department of National Revenue in Ottawa. Perseverance prevailed then as it has over the years and much has been accomplished both in senior citizen accommodation and in charities.

Our first project was the construction of Quinn House, a senior citizen complex in St. Andrews, N.B. which was officially opened on April 22, 1989 by the Grand Master M:W: Rev. Kenneth Legassick accompanied by Grand Lodge Officers and a large number of Brethren. The snow fall the night before and cold weather in no way dampened the enthusiasm of those present. Quinn House continues to operate at capacity and in a most efficient manner with thanks going to R:W: Frank Langley and his committee from St. Marks Lodge No. 5.

The second undertaking was the sponsorship of Camp Goodtime, a camp for children between the ages of seven and thirteen afflicted with cancer. In the early years this Camp was held in Nova Scotia but in 1993 the first camp in New Brunswick was held at Camp Glenburn located on the Bellisle in Kings County.

In 1994 we broadened our charitable involvement by sponsoring two young people to attend the Deaf Blind and Rubella Camp and in 1995 increased the number attending to four.

At the request of the New Brunswick Division of the Canadian Cancer Society in 1995 we were able to make funds available to provide transportation and lodging for children and their guardians when treatment or hospitalization of a child outside their residential area was required.

The Directors have felt for some time that we should have a brochure outlining our aims and I am pleased to report that a brochure is now available for distribution throughout the Jurisdiction.



During the ten year span under review, a sum in excess of \$50,000.00 has been raised by the Masons of New Brunswick for children oriented projects that we have undertaken for which we may all be immensely proud.

The Board of Directors of our Company is comprised of three Brethren from each of the seven Districts in the Jurisdiction. The Grand Master and Grand Secretary are ex-officio members of the Board. It is with regret that I report the W:B: Brian Frances, who has been our Treasurer for several years, has stepped down but I am pleased that he will remain a member of the Board. We welcome W:B: Stuart Brenton who has taken over the Treasurer's duties.

In closing, I wish to acknowledge the willing support I have received from the Directors and on their behalf to sincerely thank everyone who has supported our worthy charitable activities.

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

TO: THE MOST WORSHIPFUL THE GRAND MASTER, OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THE GRAND LODGE OF NEW BRUNSWICK F. & A. M.

During the past year some fundamental changes have been made in the administration of our Financial Assets. It was the opinion of the Finance Committee that, with the amount of investments we now have, that a more professional approach should be taken. Most of our investments are now managed by the Investment firm of Wood-Gundy.

Since taking over the management of our Investment Portfolio in June of 1995, we now have immediate access to the constantly fluctuating bond markets. Several of our investments have already been redeemed and reinvested at a more favourable rate. This has allowed us to maximize our return on investments and has resulted in a considerable profit.

Since moving the mangement of most of our investments to Wood-Gundy our portfolio is continuously updated and we are consulted on any recommendations or before any changes are made. The Finance Committee still retains the right to reject or approve any changes to our Investment Portfolio. All this has been accomplished without any cost to Grand Lodge.

The Financial Statement provided by the Grand Treasurer gives a comprehensive list of the Investment Portfolio of both the Fund of Benevolence and the Grand Lodge Investment Account as well as the income and expenditures for the past year.

During the past few years several of our higher yielding investments have matured. Over the next few years several more of our investments will be maturing and will be reinvested at current rates, considerably less than we are now receiving.

Several years ago, Grand Lodge was financed almost entirely by money guaranteed by a per capita levy. This is now changing where most of our income will soon be coming from interest earned by our investments. It is, therefore, necessary that a controlled growth in our investments continue to cover the increasing costs of Grand Lodge so that no additional costs to the Lodges or its members be incurred.

We, again, recommend that Bursaries on the amount of \$10,000.00 be given this year and that amount be taken from the Fund of Benevolence.

Camp Goodtime continues to be operated by the donations of the Lodges in this Jurisdiction. The Order of DeMolay is very active and being supported by many Masons. A group of these boys are participating at this communication.

Many things are happening in this Jurisdiction, and the year coming promises to be even better. Participation and cooperation is the secret for success, let us do both and move ahead.





REPORT OF THE MASONIC RENEWAL COMMITTEE OF NEW BRUNSWICK

Brethren, the Masonic Renewal Committee of New Brunswick may well be one of the Most Important Committees, in terms of survival of Freemasonry, in this province. Our membership is on the decline, but with the help of this Grand Lodge and the membership of this Grand Jurisdiction, it is possible to change that situation. Let us ALL look forward to increasing our attendance in the Lodge and hopefully an increase in our membership.

Shortly after becoming Grand Master, M:W:B: William H. Balser, Jr. presented me with a copy of Seven Steps – A Renewal Blueprint for Masonic Grand Lodges in North America. This program was prepared by the Masonic Renewal Committee of North America. He asked me to review the program, come up with ideas and suggestions, and charged me with the task of creating a Task Force on Masonic Renewal for New Brunswick. I am pleased to report to this Grand Jurisdiction that the Task Force has been formed and consists of 15 Masons from various parts of the Province.

Unfortunately, due to scheduling conflicts, the weather, and other commitments, only one meeting has been held to date. On February 17th, 9 members of the committee met at Hiram Lodge in Fredericton. As a result of that meeting, a Vision has been established. That Vision is to "Re-kindle Freemasonry in New Brunswick". It is hoped to accomplish this goal by (a) Restoring Pride in Masonry; (b) Promoting Masonry As A Way of Life; and (c) Developing Leadership within the Lodges.

The first step in implementing the program was taken by circulating a letter from your Grand Master. The letter promotes the use of the 'Friend to Friend' brochures. And it is hoped that ALL Masons in New Brunswick will help in this respect.

As Chairman of the committee, I hope to see Masonic Renewal developed into a regular program for the 21st century and that this Grand Lodge will support us over the next four years. I also hope that we will work with the Education Committee and Public Relations Committee to help in the Program's promotion and implementation.

During the next year, you can expect to see more programs from the committee; such as a short masonic questionnaire for th Lodges and the membership in general. As well as the promotion of the Masonic Education booklet '101 Plus Ways to Improve Interest and Attendance in Your Masonic Lodges'. The Masters ar Wardens of ALL the Lodges should study this booklet and use as many suggestions and programs in it as they possibly can.

A reminder is given to the District Deputies asking for their complete co-operation in the work of this committee. Your advice and assistance will be greatly appreciated.

In closing, I would like to thank the Grand Master for appointing me to chair Masonic Renewal. And a very special than you is extended to all the Brethren who voluntarily agreed to serv on the committee. Thanks!
